Fundraising Committee Meeting: Notes from June 8, 2022 meeting

The fundraising committee of the James Kennedy Public Library met at 5:30 pm on Wednesday, June 8, 2022. Participants were chairperson Catherine O'Hea and members Karen Kramer, and Shirley Vonderhaar. Brenda Ingles was excused.

Apparel: Read, Return, Repeat apparel continues to be available for purchase as t-shirts, long sleeve t-shirts, and hooded sweatshirts in multiple colors and sizes. Orders will be placed weekly, as they are received. Forms will be taken to the Downtown Markets this summer to encourage additional purchases.

Build-a-Basket Fundraiser: Library staff was unable to contact the highest bidder for one basket/ After waiting several weeks, we contacted the second highest bidder. They were happy to take the basket. Total income from this fundraiser was \$1139.00.

Mystery Dinner: The Dyersville Social Center is reserved for for March 4, 2023 with a potential snow date of March 11, 2023. J & D Mart indicated that both those dates were available. We are waiting for a contract from Die Laughing for main date of March 4 and snow date of March 11. Once all this is confirmed, no additional action will be needed on this topic until the fall / winter of 2022.

Donated DVDs (and books): Shirley needs to follow up with Heidi Huisman to put together a process for selling these items. Everyone is busy with the summer rush so will likely be late fall before there is any activity on this.

Greeting Cards: These upcycled / crafty donated cards will be sold for \$3.00 each or two for \$5.00. TACKL will sell them at the Downtown Market events, along with other items.

Pop-up Library and Outdoor Family Event with DQ Grill and Chill: A couple years ago we held an outdoor event in the green space at DQ Grill and Chill, and the restaurant donated a percentage of sales to the library. Since things are getting back to somewhat normal, the committee agreed it was time to reach out to DQ to see if they are interested in partnering to do something this summer. Karen reported that summer is busy and staffing is an issue. We will revisit this at a later time.

Trivia Night at O So Good for National Library Week: This was a very successful new event. 10 tables were sold ahead of time and 1 was sold at the event (O So Good had enough supplies to make an additional snack platter.) \$693 was raised at the event through special activities so this event brought in a total of \$1793. Total cost was \$476 (includes discounted wine and food for the trays and dessert) so proceeds from this event were over \$1300.00. This was a very successful – low work event and O So Good was very happy as well. This Trivia Night will replace the annual Wine and Beer Tasting Event in the spring – typically scheduled around National Library Week. The committee talked about scheduling a similar event in the fall. After

discussion they decided to wait until after the 2023 spring event to discuss if this should stay just once a year or additional events be added.

Beer Glasses: The committee agreed we should go ahead and sell the glasses we had saved for the Wine and Beer Tasting for \$5.00 each or use for incentives. Signage will be made advertising these in the library and some may be taken to the Downtown Market.

Breakfast Burrito Fundraiser: This was an easy, successful event and we had planned to offer it more often – but Marcus, who has resigned from the Board, is the chef. Since Marcus expressed interest in continuing to help with these kinds of events, Shirley will reach out to him to see if he would be interested in planning / scheduling some weekends when he might be back and what to host, or if he would be available to do as part of Shop Local Saturday in November.

Plant Sale Fundraiser: This annual event was held on Saturday, May 21 in the city parking lot adjacent to the library from 8 to 10 am. We didn't have nearly as many plants donated, or as many visitors to purchase, but we still made \$469.00.

Downtown Summer Nights: These events are scheduled for Friday, June 10 and Friday, July 8 from 6:30 to 10 pm this year. The June event will be held on 1st Ave, the July event is schedule to be at the City Square. For the past few years, this committee has taken a pop-up library and given away books; and then also sold treats. The consensus of the committee is to do the Pop-up Library from 6:30 to 8:30 pm and sell freezer pops for \$2.00 each. Catherine and Shirley will work this event.

Dyersville Downtown Market: This monthly event is scheduled for Saturdays, June 25, July 30, August 27 and September 24 from 8:00 am - 12:00 noon. Paul will take the pop-up library there as usual, and TACKL will plan to sell tote bags, greeting cards, library swag, etc. Profits will be split evening between TACKL and the Fundraising committee. The committee talked about selling the following items — depending on what TACKL can transport. Since some of these items have not yet arrived at the library, the committee will meet again before June 25 to decide what things to take and prices for everything. Glasses - \$5.00 each; Greeting Cards - \$3.00 each or 2 for \$5.00; Other potential items: Tote bags, Magnetic book marks, Cork coasters, Luggage tags, Hand sanitizer.

Utilization of Funds: At the email discussion, last month, the Committee talked about authorizing up to \$5,000 of money raised annually to help with purchasing materials if needed to help with budget concerns. These funds will be allocated as needed.

Next Meeting: The committee will meet sometime before June 25 to decide on what to sell at the Downtown Market.

FY23 Budget recommendation:

The Committee is recommended the attached spreadsheet for the FY23 budget. This budget includes the following:

- Adjusting personnel to reflection decisions at the May 2022 Board meeting to change the Senior Services Librarian position to a Senior Services Programmer position with fewer hours and a different pay scale
- Adjusting Building Insurance to reflect a revised estimate based on the FY22 actual cost
- Adjusting the supplies budget to reflect anticipated reduced cost for book covers and supplies
- Adjusting the materials budget to keep the total approved budget at the \$510,000.00 amount approved and allocated by the City Council.

One-time Lump Sum Payments to staff:

After notification that the \$14,905 Budget Amendment Request to be allocated for wages was approved, and extensive discussion and review of the FY22 budget, the Committee is recommending one-time lump sum payments to library staff as they are identified in the attached spreadsheet. These payments are based on the number of hours staff worked between January 1 and April 31, 2022 and the difference in pay rates after implementing the new Compensation Plan, and the change in city insurance.

1. Library Swag
