Tentative Schedule of Upcoming Events - August 2022 and Beyond

Adult Summer Library Program Continues! Everyone 18 and older is encouraged to participate in the 2022 program that runs until August 31. This year's theme is Read Beyond the Beaten Path. This theme features different summer experiences - from outdoor activities such as hiking, campfires. stories, and s'mores to nature programs, arts and crafts, music, and so much more! Registration begins on June 1 and adults are welcome to join throughout the summer. Downtown Summer Nights: Catherine and Pat O'Hea and Shirley worked the June event and sold out of freezer pops. The committee agreed to purchase more of the 5.5oz (giant) size and sell them at the July event for \$1.00 as well. Karen will check with Fareway about donating these, or will purchase and donate to the library. Catherine, Shirley and Karen will plan to work the Pop-up Library and Fundraiser on Friday July 8 from 6:30 to 8:30 pm at the City Square.

Dyersville Downtown Market: At previous committee meetings, the committee decided they would like to partner with TACKL to sell library merchandise at the Dyersville Downtown Market. The committee would fund the merchandize and TACKL would sell, and we would split the profits. After looking at the items available, the committee wasn't sure the items would sell and thought they would work best as prizes and incentives. When Paul reported this to the TACKL members, they wanted to try selling anyway so Shirley and Paul identified the following items and prices to take to the market:

- Tote Bag—\$5.00 each (Purchase of a tote bag includes one other item of choice for free)
- Greeting Cards—\$3.00 each or 2 for \$5.00 (not included in tote bag promotions)
- Cork Coaster—\$2.00 each or 4 for \$6.00
- Hand Sanitizer—\$2.00 each
- Luggage Tag—\$2.00 each
- Magnetic Bookmark—\$1.00 each
- T-shirt order forms (shirts to be picked up at the library at a later date)

JKPL Personnel Committee – Electronic Discussion

Participating: Committee members Karen Kramer, Lynn Osterhaus and Library Director, Shirley Vonderhaar.

The City Council of the City of Dyersville approved pay adjustments for most city staff, moving them up one step on the City Compensation Plan, at their June meetings. These adjustments are scheduled to go into effect the first pay period in July. Adjustments for other / new city staff may be considered at other times – likely on or around their hire dates.

The JKPL Compensation plan models the process of the City of Dyersville so Shirley shared this information with the JKPL Personnel Committee, inquiring if they wanted to recommend similar adjustments for eligible library staff. The attached spreadsheet includes the following segments:

- The JKPL compensation plan with steps approved by the JKPL Board in January 2022
- The JKPL staff wage adjustments that were approved in May (based on what the Council approved for city staff in January)
- Proposed wage adjustments for library staff 1 step increases. All staff who are on this document with a proposed increase to the next step have received a positive evaluation from their supervisors in the last 2 months, except for the Library Director, whose evaluation was completed in December.

These adjustments also match what was included in the FY23 budget proposal. Shirley is not recommending an adjustment for two staff at this time. She suggests that Burds be considered for an adjustment in November – after completing 1 year of service; and Boeckenstedt be considered for an adjustment in December – after 6 months of service at the Senior Services Programmer position.

After reviewing this information, the Personnel Committee is recommending that these wage adjustments be implemented for eligible library staff effective July 4, 2022. Since there is only one sitting Board member currently serving on the Personnel Committee, any action will require a motion and second from the Board.
