Read Beyond the Beaten Path: 2022 Adult Summer Library Program June 1 to August 31, 2022

The 2022 Adult Summer Program was a return to "near normal" after covid. Participation was lower than pre-covid, but activity levels are increasing. People tracked participation on a paper log Programming was offered in person and virtually.

61 adults signed up

32 participants completed one or more activities (read a book, participated in a program, used on online library service, etc.; 30 "completed" the program. In order to complete the program, participants had to complete a total of 16 activities, including reading at least 4 books.

Highest number of activities completed by one person: 70

Total number of activities completed by all participants: 790

The Friends of the Library sponsored the program again this year, committing funds to pay for incentives, programs, and refreshments. The grand prize was a Book Lover's Basket (which we have put together every year since we started this program). Incentive prizes were luggage tags or key chains using the button maker, JKPL sticky notepads, coasters, glasses, and hand sanitizer as well as various items that have been donated for prizes. Participants also had the option to select a new or gently used book that was donated to the Friends when signing up and for any level completed. Drawing prizes were items left from previous programs, donated items, and library swag. Those completing the program received a book journal.

The Fundraising committee met tuesday October 4th at 6pm . Alex and Cami were in attendance. We used this session to get on track as new committee members. We reviewed the current fundraising event schedule, discussed future fundraising plans, and discussed two new fundraising opportunities. One tied to the new Kitchen and cooking class and a put around town mini golf event. The fundraising committee also discussed the merchandise currently on hand and opportunities we have to sell or give away the promotional materials. The Fundraising committee has not yet set a date to meet for November but will discuss it following the board member meeting.

Furnishings, Art and Facilities Committee Meeting - Wednesday, October 5, 2022 at 5 pm

The Furnishings, Art, and Facilities Committee of the JKPL met on Wednesday, October 5, 2022 at 5 pm. In attendance was chairperson Ray Kruse and members Sue Englebrecht, Kami Boffeli, Betty Anne Scherrman and librarian Shirley Vonderhaar.

Covid-19 and library furnishings: During the height of the pandemic, the JKPL staff stored some library furnishings, especially soft seating, in the basement and library meeting spaces. As things have opened back up, some of these furnishings have been put back out on the floor, but some are still stored. Shirley wondered if the committee thought we should put everything back out or consider disposing of some items that may no longer be needed. Consensus of the committee was:

- Items that may have a future purpose should be stored for the time being, in case we want to put them back out
- Items that are showing wear / poorly made should be disposed of
- Items that are well made but need some repairs should be stored for future needs

Donated framed print disposition: A Grant Wood framed art print was donated to the library – to be hung or sold as the library wished. The committee agreed that we should investigate selling this print.

Teen space: Pre-covid, the JKPL had planned to put a pub style / high table and stools in the teen corner — to provide a work area for teens. This would replace the study carrel that used to be in that area. No action was taken as there was no point in purchasing furnishings while people were unable to use the space due to covid restrictions. Funds in memory of Steven Werner are available to fund this project. Paul reported that the current TACKL group were not in support of this kind of table, but he didn't have specifics regarding why. After discussion, the committee felt that providing a work area in the teen corner was appropriate, but that we would like additional information from TACKL regarding what options they would prefer. In addition, the committee felt that modifying the multipurpose program room to be more teen friendly, perhaps with some soft seating in addition to the conference tables and chairs. These suggestions will be shared with Paul so that he can communicate with the TACKL group and return with ideas and suggestions for spaces that the teens might use.

Kitchen upgrade: The Kids Can Cook project will require upgrading the sink and possibly adding more storage in kitchenette area of the Hoffman Room. Kami has some expertise in this area so will work with Kim (who will manage the Kids Can Cook project) to identify needs and develop a plan. Funds for this project will come from grant funds, Friends of the JKPL, funds in the trust, and / or fundraising activities.

Capital Projects Plan: Last year the JKPL Board approved a 10-year capital projects plan to address capital needs like roof, carpet, HVAC, etc. Shirley reported that the city budgeted \$30,000 for library capital projects in FY23 as part of this plan. These funds are part of the city's capital projects budget, not part of the library budget so use will need to be coordinated with the city administrator. The AC unit in the server room was replaced using these funds in July (FY23)

Capital and / or Maintenance Project Priorities: The committee agreed that the first priority should be the kitchen improvements as those will be needed as part of the Kid Can Cook programs. In addition, they discussed the following:

- The JKPL replaced the locking mechanisms on two of the heavy front entrance doors this summer. The parts have been discontinued so it took Mr. Lock and Key some time to locate and replace. The consensus of the committee is that we should investigate purchasing and storing one or two additional locking mechanisms so they would be on hand when / if the other two doors require replacement. Shirley will contact Mr. Lock and Key regarding this need.
- The capital projects plan includes replacing the library carpet in FY23. Estimated cost for this would be more than the total allocated for FY23. The committee agreed that before we replace the carpet we should evaluate the need for wall covering improvements, fresh paint, etc. Shirley mentioned there might be some grants available to purchase paint for these kinds of projects as well. In addition, the exterior door that was replaced in the Hoffman room and the wall surrounding needs some cosmetic work. No decisions were made but this topic will be discussed and decisions made at a future meeting.

1. Discover Downtown Dyersville Alliance

The Library is part of the DDDA. We have been asked to contribute \$250 towards marketing materials. In the past this has been used for print ads and for the billboard on Highway 20. Part of this money will go towards renewing the billboard lease which also has lights now. Other marketing costs are to be determined. The group agreed to contribute towards the marketing since the DDDA includes us in their listing of businesses downtown. Plus we partner with many of the businesses downtown yearly for various events.

2. Annual Report

The group reviewed the format the library has used for the past 5 years for its annual report and discussed ways to freshen it up. Dawn will take over creating the report and will rely on the committee members and Shirley as needed, if/when she gets stuck. The goal is to have the report ready for the board to review at the November meeting then it will go to the City Council.

Selected Service Responses, Goals, and Objectives:

This list of objectives is pulled from the JKPL Strategic Plan. They have deadlines that are past or approaching soon; or that staff have been working on. Information is red / italics is the status of work on the objective.

Know Your Community: Community Resources and Services

Residents will have a central source for information about the wide variety of programs, services, and activities provided by community agencies and organizations.

Goal #1: Residents are knowledgeable about the services and resources available at the library.

Objective: The Librarian in charge of social media will research current, new, and popular social media options to determine if there is a need for the JKPL to modify resources used to provide information to the community by July 2022. Paul has been researching TikTok and Snap Chat. He has decided that Snap Chat would not work well for the library, however TikTok has some potential. He will be attending a session at ILA on using TikTok in libraries and is coordinating with Devin about launching one for the library to promote library programs and services. He will also be working with the JKPL Marketing Committee on this project.

Objective: The Librarian in charge of social media will investigate utilizing targeted social media ads to share information about library services and resources by December 2022. Paul has done some research into this and the tools that are available on Facebook and Instagram. These tools require a higher level (number) of followers than we currently have so staff suggest revising the deadline to December 2023 and he will investigate again in the future.

Goal #2: Community organizations work together to promote events and services.

Objective: The Assistant Director will develop partnerships with local businesses and organizations to jointly promote community events and services by January 2023. Dawn is actively participating in the Downtown Dyersville Alliance to make sure the JKPL is informed and involved where appropriate.

Goal #3: Residents will find information and resources about a variety of community organizations, services and businesses at the library.

Objective: The Assistant Director will investigate the possibility of posting information on the city pillars by July 2022. This is not an option. While the pillars were designed to potentially hold signage, the city has decided to not allow anything to be posted by anyone. Reasons provided were that it takes away from the look of the pillars and city staff don't want to have to determine what is appropriate/not appropriate to post there.

Celebrate Diversity: Cultural Awareness

Residents will have programs and services that promote appreciation and understanding of their personal heritage and the heritage of others in the community.

Goal #1: Children will experience diverse presenters, programs, and collections.

Objective: The Youth Services Librarian will provide children with the opportunity to attend performances and / or events celebrating different cultures by January 2026. A summer reading program in 2022 focused on foods from various cultures. Kim has been in contact with Laura from Rio Blanco about doing a program on Mexican culture and food. Kim has reached out to the Meskwaki tribe about doing a program for Native American Heritage Month, but has not heard back.

Objective: The Youth Services Librarian will share stories from around the world on the JKPL Facebook and YouTube channels by September 2023. Kim is researching various stories and how to make them engaging on virtual platforms (flannel boards, puppets, etc.) without violating copyright laws.

Objective: The Youth Services Librarian will schedule at least one program per year featuring diverse presenters by July 2023. Kim has reached out to the Multicultural Family Center in Dubuque about partnering to bring programs to our community. This is still in progress. She has also contacted presenters from further afield, but the prices are very prohibitive (cheapest was around \$2500.)

Objective: The Youth Services Librarian will complete a collection diversity audit by March 2024 Kim is researching the process and will be attending a session addressing the topic at ILA.

Goal #2: Library staff will recognize and appreciate diversity in the community to ensure that every patron receives excellent service

Objective: Library staff will create a resource list of "difficult" topics so that patrons can locate information without having to ask staff for assistance if they prefer not to by September 2023. Paul has started discussing this objective with TACKL and they are brainstorming topics to be included.

Objective: All library staff will have the opportunity to participate in Spanish for Librarians training by December 2023. *Mango Languages has a Spanish for Librarians module that all staff can utilize*.

Objective: The Library Director will develop a plan to provide dedicated, paid staff time for training for all staff on a regular basis by July 2022. The JKPL Budget includes funds for training and all staff are encouraged to attend conferences, webinars, etc. that pertain to their job duties. Shirley is also working on a more formal plan to include training at staff meetings and develop an annual local Inservice / training opportunity.

Goal #3: The community will be enriched by celebrating and developing a greater understanding of diversity.

Objective: Librarians in charge of programming at all levels will research, plan, and schedule performances, activities, and / or events for all ages celebrating different cultures by January 2024. Paul is planning to run a China based culture awareness program in the winter months. He will be working with Annie Gulick on this event.

Objective: The Library Director will investigate the possibility of offering a multigenerational or adult book club featuring books with diverse viewpoints or characters by September 2022. Shirley and Paul are discussing options and ideas, as well as local interest in creating a diversity themed book club. In addition, we are planning to partner with Carnegie Stout for their 2024 county-wide book discussion of the book Gender Queer.

Make Informed Decisions: Information Fluency, Job and Career Development, Be an Informed Citizen

Residents will have the resources they need to identify and analyze risks, benefits, and alternatives before making decisions that affect their lives.

Goal #1: Those exploring careers are able to access information regarding businesses hiring locally.

Objective: Librarians in charge of programming for teens and adults will investigate creation of programs, events, or activities featuring local businesses by December 2022. Paul was working with Annie Gulick on creating a job fair program for Aug 2022, but the timing for the summer did not work out. He will continue working on this objective with her as well as consider other ideas.

Objective: The Young and Emerging Adult Services Librarian will investigate methods to support matching business and organizational needs with potential employee skills by July 2023. *This was part of the project Paul was working on with Annie (see objective above)*.

Goal #2: Job seekers have the skills they need to gain employment or advance their career.

Goal #3: Community members of all ages will find programming and other resources for life events.

Objective: Librarians in charge of collection development will evaluate physical materials and online resources focused on life events and consider expanding and / or updating the library's collections in those areas by September 2023. Staff are including this in the diversity audit process.

Goal #4: Teens will develop critical thinking skills for analyzing informational resources of all kinds.

Objective: The Young and Emerging Adult Services Librarian will evaluate print materials and online resources focused on critical thinking and information literacy and consider expanding and / or updating the library's collections in those areas by December 2022. Paul has already begun to add more titles to the young adult collection, in both fiction and nonfiction, about information literacy.

Goal #5: Adults will develop critical thinking skills for analyzing informational resources of all kinds.

Express Creativity: Create and Share Content

Residents will have the services and support they need to express themselves by creating original print, video, audio, or visual content in a real-world or online environment.

Goal #1: Students have resources to support and develop their writing skills.

Objective: The Youth Services Librarian will investigate starting a summer creative writing group by June 2022. Staff were not able to implement this for 2022 but are planning to include in the 2023 Summer Reading Program activities.

Objective: The Youth Services and Young and Emerging Adult Services Librarians will explore incorporating writing into the typical summer reading program activities by March 2023. Paul is planning on incorporating writing aspects in the 2023 program for teens —If you write a review it is worth extra chances, etc. Kim will include writing programming in the final schedule of summer reading activates planned for 2023.

Goal #2: Members of the community have access to an environment that nurtures creative thinking.

Objective: The librarian in charge of social media will provide an opportunity for local citizens to share their talents and skills on the JKPL Facebook and YouTube Channels by December 2023 Paul has been talking with local experts about creating these types of videos. He is hoping to launch it as a monthly video series in November 2022.

Objective: The Youth Services and Young and Emerging Adult Services Librarians will partner with the local schools to provide an opportunity for students in debate, speech, theatre, etc. to demonstrate their skills in a public setting, prior to the actual performance or competition by July 2023. Kim has coordinated with The Road Less Travelled Community Theater to present portions of their plays at the library. These plays, while not part of local schools, star students from the local schools.

Goal #3: Students are provided with S.T.E.M. focused opportunities to supplement their learning and bridge gaps in their knowledge.

Objective: Library staff in charge of S.T.E.M. programming will investigate best times and topics and develop a plan for S.T.E.M. programming by August 2022. STEAM programs are currently offered weekly as part of the STEAM Fun Fridays. Building block programs are offered monthly. Additional STEM based program are offered regularly but a plan, included best times and topics has not yet been developed. We suggest amending this deadline to March 2023 to allow staff time to survey potential participants and develop a more formal schedule.

Objective: The Library Director will explore removing restrictions on circulation of hotspots and S.T.E.M. items included in the Library of Things. Shirley will be working with the JKPL Policy Committee in the next couple of months to evaluate relevant policies and consider recommending changes in policy to reduce or remove restrictions and barriers on use of these items.
