### Notes from the Fundraising Committee Meeting - Wednesday, March 8, 2023

The Fundraising Committee of the JKPL met on Wednesday, March 8, 2023 at 6 pm. Participants were chairperson Alex Wiezorek, and members Karen Kramer, Kami Bofelli, and Shirley Vonderhaar. Brenda Ingles was excused.

Love My Library Giving Tree: This event has officially closed. We have brought in \$4657 to date and Randy's has a check for us to pick up. Shirley noted that proceeds in FY22 were \$8070 and there were some past donors who had not yet contributed. She was concerned that they might have missed the publicity about the event as they were not Chamber members so didn't receive a letter. The committee discussed whether it would be appropriate to send a message to those donors who may have missed that this fundraiser was happening. Shirley was directed to reach out to those donors.

**Build-a-Basket Fundraiser:** This event has started. We have some great baskets donated and likely a few more to come. This auction ends at 3 pm on Sunday, April 2 with an open house / reception. Alex and Shirley will work the closing of this event.

Mystery Dinner Theater: This event was held on Saturday, March 4. We sold 76 tickets and paid for 84 meals (including performers.) Income was: Ticket sales: \$3960.00; Donations (at event): \$156.00 for a Total: \$4116 Expenses were: J & D Catering – meals: \$1764.00 (84 meals at \$21 each); Brew Ha Ha players -\$1367.00 Facebook boosts - \$30.00; Soda – 10.00. Reports have been very position so it is likely we will offer this event again in 2024 and continue to work with the Brew Ha Ha Players. Planning for 2024 should include discussion of the cost and potential changes to the ticket or table prices.

National Library Week – April 23 to 29 (NLW) Breakfast Burrito Fundraiser: We have scheduled this fundraiser event as a Kick off for NLW on Saturday, April 22 from 9 to 11 am. It will be held outdoors if the weather permits. Alex and Kami are available to help sell that morning. Karen is available to help prep the night before, if the Ingles would like that. Shirley will be out of town that weekend. 75 burritos were made for the November event and they were sold out. The committee decided the quantity should be based on what Marcus and Brenda are willing / able to make the night before, rather than deciding on an amount to try and sell. The committee also agreed to keep the \$5.00 per burrito price, but not offer any beverages or extras. Shirley will reach out the Marcus and Brenda to see what they would like to do and find out what quantity of ingredients and supplies they need. Kami will request a donation of ingredients from Fareway.

NWL Trivia Event: This event will be on Friday, April 28 at O So Good Winery & Distillery. Guests are encouraged to come at 6:30 to get settled, with trivia starting at 7 pm. Tables will be sold for up to 6 guests at \$120 per table (up from \$100 last year due to higher costs). Both the JKPL and O So Good will sell tickets. Table price includes charcuterie board for 6, 2 bottles of wine of their choice, and a dessert to share. O So Good will put on tablecloths and the library will do something decorative (as last year) to designate the library tables. The trivia event will include special twists like auctioning off a category, doubling points, etc. to raise additional funds for the library. The deadline to purchase tables is April 21st. O So Good will provide prizes for first and second place — open to all trivia participants; and JKPL will provide a swag basket as a prize, eligible only to those purchasing a table. O So Good will take all the proceeds for the table sales, and donate a portion back. This is expected to be about 50% of the total income based on how last year went. JKPL will do posters, tickets, social media, etc. and O So Good will do paid radio ad.

Yard Sign Sales: Signs will be available for a donation in April and May while supplies last.

**Spring Plant Sale:** After discussion the committee decided to schedule this annual event for Saturday, May 20, Karen is not available to provide plant advice on that morning, but suggested we ask Carol Ruden, Carol Pettinger, Don & Dianne Kramer, and / or Sue Engelbrecht to assist at this event to provide some plant expertise.

Sales at Pop-up Library at Downtown Summer Nights: The Fundraising Committee will again host the pop-up library and sell freezer pops and the Downtown Summer Nights. These are scheduled for Friday, June 9 and July 14. Karen can work on June 9 and Kami can work on July 14. Karen will donate the freezer pops.

**Sales at Pop-Up Library at Downtown Market:** TACKL will again sell library merchandise as part of the pop-up library hosted at these monthly events when they have volunteers available. Profits are split between TACKL and the fundraising committee.

**Putting Around Dyersville:** After discussion, the committee has decided to consider this event for 2024. It will be a large event and take a lot of planning and coordinating. Rather than rushing to do, the committee decided it would be better to take more time to put this together.

**Partnership with 7 Hills:** Alex agreed to speak with 7 Hills about partnering for a bowling night fundraiser supporting the library. He will report back.

**Gingerbread Scene:** At previous meetings, the committee had discussed a gingerbread scene event during a Downtown Market event with a County Fair theme. After discussion, the committee is changing this up. They deciding that holding the Gingerbread Scene event as part of the Cookie Walk would be a good fit. Participants would potential bring in the gingerbread scenes a week before the cookie walk. Details on this will be discussed in the fall.

**Book Sculpture:** Instead of doing a gingerbread scene event as part of the Downtown Market, the committee discussed hosting a book sculpture event. At the June market (and after at the JKPL) participants will be able to pick up books to be upcycled into something creative – book folding, sculptures, etc. Entries would then be on display at the July Market and people could donate money somehow to vote for their favorites. Details will be discussed at the next meeting.

**Fall Event at O So Good:** Karie and Lee Ostwinkle are interested in planning a fall event with the JKPL We are tentatively planning a horror / Halloween themed trivia night for Friday, October 13. Details will be decided closer to the date.

**Painting / Décor Item:** O So Good would be a good partner for this kind of event also. The committee will keep thinking about this idea.

#### **Furnishings, Art and Facilities Committee**

#### Notes from the March 9, 2023 Zoom meeting

The Furnishings, Art, and Facilities Committee of the JKPL met on Thursday, March 9, 2023 at 6:00 pm via Zoom. In attendance were members Sue Englebrecht, Kami Boffeli, and librarian Shirley Vonderhaar. Ray Kruse and Betty Anne Scherrman were excused.

Hoffman Room / Kitchen Work: The committee is working to complete this project, which is being funding by grant funds, the Friends of the JKPL, and fundraising efforts as it is part of the Kids Can Cook project. A dishwasher has been selected from Scotty's Appliance and will be installed by MM Mechanical. MM Mechanical will also provide and install the high arc faucet when the space is ready. In the loop for installing dishwasher (purchasing from Scotty's) and faucets when we are ready. Brian (MM Mechanical) advised that said the project (counter, sink and dishwasher) should all go in at once so the committee needs to make decisions regarding the countertops and related items before we can proceed. At the last discussion, the committee had decided to work with a local contractor or handyman to do the countertop and sink install and potentially to purchase these items independently at Lowe's or Menards or similar business. After discussion, the committee decided the following:

- Shirley will contact Brian Osterhaus to see if he would be willing to take on this small project. If
  he is not, she will contact Jim Hense (Redo to New). Plan would be for the contractor to
  measure the space, order the countertop and sink as specified by library staff, and install.
- The committee thought a stainless steel backsplash like Ray Kruse had described at an early committee meeting would be appropriate for this space so Shirley will talk with him about that part of the project.

**Electrical issues in Hoffman Room:** The intent with the Kids Can Cook project was to have six workstations. Staff has discovered that the wiring in the Hoffman room will only support 3 toaster ovens or similar appliances at one time. Shirley talked to Brian (MM Mechanical) about this issue and his recommendation was: After reviewing the power situation yesterday I believe we should run a sub panel out of your upstairs panel and install in the closet. Then you would be able to run power from your sub panel to the rest of the kitchen out of that panel. I would say we surface mount emt on the walls to add outlets so you aren't tripping breakers all the time. Shirley shared this recommendation with Terry (City Worker) and he concurs. Following discussion, the committee decided on the following:

- Shirley will talk to Mick before moving forward with this project as it is building related.
- Terry indicated that he could do this work (or at least some of it) but he would not be available immediately. Shirley will talk with Terry and John (Public Works Director) to see if we can get this project on Terry's schedule for May as the Kids Can Cook classes will be finished for the season at that time. Based on these conversations, Shirley will follow up with MM Mechanical to see what portions of this project, if any, we want them to quote for us.

**Teen Space:** Beth was checking for hightop tables / chairs and TACKL has some thoughts on chairs for the game room so we will keep working on this. This project is funded by donations already on hand. The Committee is comfortable with Shirley, Paul, and TACKL members making the decisions on what to purchase.

**Men's Bathroom:** Shirley updated the committee that the drywall and paint were completed in the men's bathroom. Tile was scheduled to go in on Thursday but did not – she is assuming the weather might have interfered.

Capital Projects: Committee members talked about the capital projects 10- year plan (FY22 to FY31) that was develop a couple years ago. The committee agreed that the current priority for the library would be upkeep and beautification. The library facility is more than 20 years old. It needs new paint, carpet and window treatments, as well as some minor maintenance such as can be seen around the door from the Hoffman Room to the parking lot. The JKPL budgeted and the city allocated \$28,000 in FY22. \$30,000 was allocated for FY23. \$4,526 was spend in July or August of 2022 for the air conditioning unit in the server room. We are assuming some of these funds will need to be used for the deductible related to the men's bathroom issue. Shirley has applied for the Paint Iowa Beautiful grant which, if received, will fund the cost for paint. Shirley was directed to speak with Mick about these priorities and the procedures we need to follow to move forward with them.
