Notes from the October 2023 email discussion

Members of the JKPL Fundraising committee met via email to discuss upcoming events. Participants were Alex Wiezorek, Kami Boffeli and Shirley Vonderhaar.

If You Paint It, They Will Come Canvas Painting Fundraiser: This event will be held on Thursday, October 12 @ 6:00 pm. Participants will go to the Field of Dreams for this paint and sip fundraiser. Tickets are \$65 each and include all the supplies needed to create a 16x20 inch canvas painting plus one entry into a door prize for a FoD gift basket or a library swag basket. Registration is being managed online by Captured on Canvas. Food and drink will be available to purchase and there will be drink specials. Field of Dreams is donating the venue and a gift basket. The event will be held at the DugOut or, if needed for space, the Event Center at FoD. Cost for the art component is \$45.00 so the library will make \$20 per person participating at this event. Kami will attend to represent the library.

Halloween Trivia Night Fundraiser at O So Good: This event will be held on Friday, October 27 from 6:30 to 9:00 pm. Trivia will be provided by Trivial Dudes, hosted by O So Good Winery & Distillery. Guests may purchase a table for up to six guests for \$120.00. Price includes two bottles of wine or equal value in beer and / or mixed drinks, a charcuterie board for six, and a dessert to share. The committee discussed whether offer something for smaller groups or individuals but decided not to change. The ticket comes with the same value, whether there is a full six people attending. Menu items and additional beverages will be available to purchase. Tickets maybe be purchased at the library or O So Good Winery & Distillery before October 23. As of 10/3/23, the library has sold 4 tables. Maximum available is 20. There will be Halloween themed questions as well as general trivia and the contest will include some special twists like Phone a Friend, Mulligans and other ways to win - with funds going to support the JKPL. Costumes are encouraged and there will be a prize for the best individual costume as well as the best group / table costume. The Trivial Dudes will be judges. Prizes will be awarded by O So Good to the top two scoring teams. There will also be a special library themed prize for the highest scoring purchased table. Guests are welcome to arrive at any time but trivia will begin promptly at 7 pm. Library tables will be grouped together and decorated. Lisa Christopher is making and donating the decorations. Decorations may be taken home by those seated at each table. All funds will go to O So Good Winery & Distillery and they will donate a portion of the evening's proceeds to the James Kennedy Public Library. Shirley will attend to represent the library.

Wreath-it-up: This event started in September with members of the community being invited to make and donate wreaths or other wall hangings to be sold in a silent auction. Items should be brought to the library by mid-October. As of 10/3/23, 5 items have been donated. The Silent Auction will run October 9 – November 12. The Donor Reception and start of voting for ribbons will be on Sunday, October 15, from 1:30 to 3:30 pm. Dawn will set up the cookies and punch and put out the voting information as Shirley is out of town. The committee will decide on the voting categories after the Board meeting on October 13 – based on what has been donated. 2021 categories were: Most Creative, Best Seasonal, and People's Choice (overall favorite). Kami will attend the reception to represent the Fundraising committee. The JKPL will host a closing reception on November 12 from 2 to 3:30 pm and auction will end promptly at 3 pm that day. Shirley will set organize the wreaths and refreshments for this final event. Alex will assist with closing of this event and calling the winners.

Breakfast Burritos for Small Business Saturday: This event will be held on Saturday, November 25 from 9:00 to 11:00 am. Egg, sausage and cheese burritos will be available for \$5.00 each — while supplies last. The committee discussed adding a beverage but decided against this because they went unsold when

offered the last time. Weather permitting, a tent will be set up outside the library for this event; otherwise, this will be set up in the Hoffman Community Room. Fareway of Dyersville is donating all the ingredients. Shirley is out of town this weekend so Paul will be the staff member helping with set up. Kami is available to work that Saturday and Alex may be available. Shirley has texted Brenda to see if she is available to help or provide guidance in making the burritos as she is our expert. Kami has indicated she might be available to help as well. Final details will be determined in the next couple of weeks.

Layette Lady's Quilt Sale: This event usually starts immediately after the Wreath event and ends right before Christmas so tentative dates are November 13 to December 22. Shirley will reach out to the Layette group to confirm interest in partnering for this event.

Cookie Walk: This event is scheduled for Friday, December 1 from 1 to 5 pm, Saturday, December 2 from 9 to 3 pm, and Sunday, December 3 from 1 to 4 pm. Additional plates of cookies will be available the week of the December 4 – while supplies last. If sufficient quantities are donated, plates of cookies will be taken to business partners in the community as a thank you for their support in 2023. The committee has agreed that pricing needs to increase so the price for this year will be \$8.00 for 1 plate / dozen and \$15.00 for 2 plates / dozen. The event will be managed as we have the last 2 years. Library staff and volunteers will start calling past donors and Friends members the first week of November, inviting them to donate sweet treats to be dropped off on November 30 or December 1. Based upon last year's sales, we will need about 300 dozen cookies. Cookies will be stored in the game room and numbered samples will be on the table under the skylight. Visitors will be given a form to select their cookie types and volunteers will fill the plates. Supplies needed for this event are plates, basket bags, decorative ribbons, food service gloves, and the donated sweets. Shirley will check and order any needed supplies. Board members are invited to make and donate treats as well as consider working a shift at this event. The Downtown Market group is also planning a winter event on 12/2 from 1 to 5 pm. The committee is hoping to take cookies to sell at this event, but more details are needed before making any decisions.

Winter Fest: The Downtown Market group is planning a Winter event on 12/2. The committee would like to be involved in some capacity, but more information is needed. Shirley noted that the committee will need to decide about this in October if they wish information about it to be included in the JKPL November events schedule.

Spring Garage Sale: Alex is working on this and will have suggested plan to share with the committee at the next meeting.

Putting Around Dyersville: No update.

Next Meeting: To be decided.

Programs Policy

1. Introduction: A library program is an event that promotes the use of library materials, facilities, or services and / or offers the community an informational, entertaining, or cultural experience. Programs are planned for the interest and enlightenment of all the people of the community. The James Kennedy Public Library strives to offer a variety of programs that reflect the broad range of community interests.

Priorities for library programming will be those programs that support the service directions that are part of the James Kennedy Public Library Strategic Plan:

- Know Your Community: Community Resources and Services
- Celebrate Diversity: Cultural Awareness
- Make Informed Decisions: Life Choices, Information Fluency, Job and Career Development, Be an Informed Citizen
- Express Creativity: Create and Share Content
- 2. Age Groups: Programs are conducted for people of all ages.
 - a. **Children's Programs**: Programs are conducted for children of all ages and their families for the purpose of promoting reading and the use of library resources and services, broadening literacy and language experience, and sharing the heritage of children's literature. Programs may also be offered based on patron request, or that would attract children to the library.
 - b. Young Adult Programs: Programs are conducted for teenagers (generally considered to be $6^{th} 12^{th}$ grade) to promote reading and the use of library resources and services. Attention is also given to programs that address concerns and issues facing teenagers, programs that are requested by patrons, and programs that may attract teenagers to the library.
 - c. Adult Programs: A wide variety of programming is offered for adults of all ages, with priority given to programs that promote reading and literacy, the dissemination of information, and the appreciation of culture and the arts. Programs may also be offered that address the concerns and interests of the community, are based upon patron request, or that would attract adults to the library.

3. Policies:

a. Fees

- Generally, library programs shall be free and open to the public. Optional charges may be levied for materials that the participants will keep or when required by a partner organization
- Public programs planned for library fund-raising may include an admission fee if such is approved by the Library Board of Trustees.

b. Enrollment:

• Attendance at programs shall not be restricted. The library may limit attendance based on age, gender, etc; or require adult supervision as deemed appropriate based on content, space and target audience of the program.

• Due to space limitations, some programs may have limited enrollment. In these cases, since Dyersville residents support the library through their tax dollars, when a program has limited capacity, first priority may be given to local residents.

c. Outreach Programs:

- The library may offer special or regular programs away from the library facility. These programs will typically be offered in partnership with another organization or to serve a special need.
- Examples of Outreach Programs may include but are not limited to visits to places that support the needs of senior citizens, visits to daycares and schools, and popup library activities.
- Programs may be offered on a regular basis (weekly / monthly) or be special one-time events.
- For any program that is offered regularly, guidelines will be developed defining what the program is, who is eligible to attend, how frequently the program will be offered, and how participants will be selected.

d. Special requests:

- The library provides special group tours or library orientations upon request and as staff and time permit. Some aspects of these programs may be planned jointly with the requesting group. All children's groups must be well supervised by the organization sponsoring the visit.
- The library may provide special programs regarding library collections, facilities, and services upon request.
- The library may offer program opportunities away from the library facility. Programs may be offered at a different location because of space needs or target audience.
- The library may partner with other organizations to provide programs. The library policies for programs will apply to any co-sponsored event.

e. Other:

- Library programs may be cancelled or rescheduled due to low attendance, insufficient numbers registering, staff or presenter being unavailable, or other similar issues.
- When hosting public events the James Kennedy Public Library reserves the right to take photos of the room and anyone in attendance. Attendance at library programs, events, or in library spaces constitutes consent to be photographed or filmed for use in in-house documentation of library events. Any photos or videos used in print or electronic publicity of the library can be used without consent as long as faces are not visible. James Kennedy Public Library will not identify adults visible in photos using a full name or personal identifying information without permission. No photos showing a child's face will be used nor will photos containing any identifying information of a child be used without written

- approval from a parent or legal guardian. Those present at library events where photos or video are being taken may ask to not be photographed or videotaped.
- Library programs will be non-commercial in nature. Although a businessperson or other professional expert may present a program, the information should be general in nature. No solicitation of business is permitted.
- The sale of products at library programs is generally not allowed. There are two exceptions:
 - 1. Because the library wants to encourage reading, writing, and the appreciation of culture and because distribution channels for these materials are often lacking, writers, performers and artists may sell their own works at the library following the library program.
 - 2. The Friends of the James Kennedy Public Library may sell items at library programs they sponsor.

All program attendees are expected to abide by the rules described in the "Conduct in the Library" policy.
