Notes from Friends Meeting – February 8, 2024

As of January 29, 2024, the Friends have \$31,793.84 in their checking account and a CD value of \$11,678.32.

The Friends membership drive began January 8, 2024. As of 2/7/24 they have a total of 139 paid members. The membership drive has brought in \$2,470 in dues and \$5,500 in donations.

The January used book sale was very successful. It brought in \$1,258.15 – the most income at one sale ever.

The 2024 Bus Trip fundraiser will be on May 8, 2024 to Jersey Boys, with a stop at the Tycogo Winery. Price per ticket is \$115.00. Tickets are already sold out.

The Friends Bylaws were reviewed and updated to reflect the change in membership fees and increasing the length of the officer terms from 2 years to 4 years.

The Friends approved \$350.00 for an Egyptology presentation by author Jocelyn Green in April. They also approved \$5,000.00 for programs, books, and incentives for children's summer programs as follows: Quest Kakopo - \$495; Dino O'Dell - \$450; Makayla Oz, Magician - \$450; Absolute Science: Bubbles (at Downtown Market) - \$525; Blank Park Zoo - \$250; Climb Theatre: Country Mouse and the City Mouse - \$600; Absolute Science: Butterflies (at Downtown Market) - \$525; Squishies and food snacks for prizes - \$250; Books for 1000 Books Before Kindergarten - \$300; Books as sign up incentives for Children's SRP- \$1,155.

The Friends also discussed funds available concerns about potential budget shortfalls. They are potentially willing to help fill in gaps if there are budget shortfalls. Specific requests and needs should be brought to the group when the JKPL knows more about the city budget appropriation.

Notes from the February 9-12, 2024 Fundraising Committee email discussion

Members of the JKPL Fundraising committee discussed fundraising projects via email February 9-12, 2024. Participants were Alex Wiezorek, Kami Boffeli and Shirley Vonderhaar. Brenda Ingles was excused.

Soup Fundraiser: This event was very successful. Proceeds were \$1026 and all soup was sold at the event. We did not have any quarts left to sell – and there were people interested in purchasing. Comments to consider for 2024:

- We gave out 2 gift certificates (1 free meal) and at least one was brought in. This seems an easy way to market.
- Some people did opt to eat at the library and appreciated this option. Suggestion was to provide some kind of beverage for those eating in. Decision on this will be make when planning for 2025
- If we had more soup, we could have sold more after the event so as part of planning will consider finding more donors (former Board members, staff members, community members) and / or asking people to donate more soup.

Love My Library Giving Tree: This event started officially on January 8 and runs until February 29. Since the kick-off wasn't tied to Soup Fundraiser there was discussion that in the future we just plan this for all of January and February. A decision on this will be made when planning for 2025. Response this year so far has been lower than recent years but hopefully donations will continue to come in.

Mystery Dinner Theater: This event is coming up on February 24. Last day to sell tickets if 2/17. AS of 2/12 we have sold 7 tables and 2 individual tickets. Last year we sold 10 tables and 10 additional tickets. We are hoping there will be more sales this week.

Build-a-Basket Fundraiser: This event started February 1 and the silent auction will run March 1 to March 24. Some baskets have already been donated and we will start putting them out the week of 2/12.

Garage Sale Fundraiser: This new event is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, June 1 - the Saturday of the city-wide garage sales. Current plan is to accept donations the week of May 27 and use the Hoffman Room for sorting and organizing. We may wish to request the City close the parking lot for the event and may need to reduce programming in the Hoffman Room for the week of May 27 – for storing and sorting donated items. Two to three volunteers will be needed for sorting and pricing as well as to manage sales the day of the event. Alex is taking lead for this and additional details will be determined over the next few months.

NWL Trivia Event: This event is typically held at O So Good Winery in connection with National Library Week. April 7 - 13, 2024 is NLW. Shirley has reached out to the owners of O So Good but hasn't heard back yet about their interest and scheduling.

Breakfast Burrito Carry Out Fundraiser: This event is typically held in connection with National Library Week from 9 to 11 (or sold out.) Potential Days would be Saturday, April 6 or 13. Brenda Ingles has stated she is again willing to make the burritos for this event. Other committee members will assist as needed. The date for this will be decided after we have heard from O So Good about the trivia event.

We will again ask Fareway to sponsor by donating the ingredients. Alex is likely available to manage sales.

Yard Sign Sales: We still have signs in storage so will make these available in April and May (for NLW) for a donation. These may also be available to purchase at the Garage Sale.

Spring Plant Sale: This event is typically held a Saturday morning, from 8 to 10 am, in May - not a holiday weekend. Potential dates are May 4 and May 18. Shirley has contacted Karen Kramer to see if she has a recommendation and if she is available to assist.

Sales at Pop-Up Library at DTSN and Downtown Market: The committee typically take a pop-up library and sell freezer pops at the Downtown Summer Night events and TACKL sells library swag at the Downtown Market. We have supplies on hand for these events so will continue this summer. Volunteers to work each event will be discussed at the next meeting.

Book Art Fundraiser: 2023 was our first year for this event. It didn't bring in a lot of income but was fun and has a lot of potential to grow. The committee will discuss this event at their next meeting and decide how to proceed. If following the 2023 pattern, Kickoff will be at the June Downtown Market with the donation event at the July Downtown Market. Last year 7 Hills donated a bowling party to the library — which was used for the prize. Committee will discuss requesting a similar donation or alternative prizes.
