Establishing his medical practice in Strawberry Point, his first clients were newly arriving immigrants, Indians, prairie banditti, and chicken thieves. Dr. Wiltse eventually would team up with Dr. Ward from Oxbow, and together they aided authorities with murder investigations across Bremer, Clayton, Delaware, and Fayette Counties. But the eruption of the Civil War in 1860 threatened to destroy Dr. Wiltse's dream of making a better life for himself and his family in their new homeland.

Dr. Wiltse's life is the basis for Betty Brandt Passick's historical fiction novel, *The Black Bag of Dr. Wiltse*. Come meet the author and hear about this forgotten piece of local history and the book it inspired! Copies of the book will be available for purchase from the author. Color Our World: 2025 Adult Summer Library Program June 1 to August 31, 2025

85 adults signed up

46 participants completed one or more activities (read a book, participated in a program, used on online library service, etc.); 40 "completed" the program. In order to complete the program, participants had to complete a total of 16 activities, including reading at least 4 books.

Highest number of activities completed by one person: 84

Total number of activities completed by all participants: 1,072

Participants were able to select from the incentives for every four activities completed. Incentive prizes were bookmarks, luggage tags, JKPL sticky notepads, coasters, glasses, etc. as well as various items that have been donated for prizes. Participants also had the option to select a new or gently used book that was donated to the Friends when signing up and for any level completed. Every four items completed earned an entry into the prize drawing at the end of the program. Prizes were items left from previous programs, donated items, and library swag. Since the theme was art related, those completing the program were able to select a coloring book and markers, colored pencils or watercolors; a watercolor kit, or a diamond art kit. Those completing the program were also eligible for one entry into the grand prize drawing of their choice: 2 ski rental / life passes donation as part of the Love My Library campaign by Sundown; book lover's basket, arts and crafts basket, and JKPL swag basket.

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Notes from September 15, 2025 Friends of the JKPL Meeting.

The Friends approved attending *Fiddler on the Roof* at Circa 21 on May 6, 2026 as their next bus trip fundraiser.

The Friends approved all JKPL funding and allocation requests. Funds previously contributed to the JKPL but underspent (\$703.22) were reallocated to fund the programs presented by Bremer (\$100), Sprout (\$150), and Scott (\$486). The funds previously contributed for Children's Summer Program activities and books that were unused (\$1,152.67) will remain in the Trust account to be used for 2026 Children's Summer Library Program expenses.

The Friends will issue a check for \$5,250.00 to fund the following:

- \$1,000.00 for the KEYS to Dementia Prevention expenses
- \$250.00 for Passick presentation
- \$500.00 for 1000 Books Before Kindergarten books
- \$1,000.00 for Storywalk ongoing expenses
- \$1,500.00 for 2026 Children's Summer Library Program books for incentives (match to DACF grant)
- \$1,500.00 to sponsor spring book discussion on *Baseball Spy* by Scott Reister with Xavier and WD fourth and / or fifth grade classes.

(Note: The total for all approved requests is actually \$5,750.00. The Friends officially approved \$5,250 - the total noted above - but also intended to approve all requests. Shirley spoke with the Friends' President and they will address this at their next meeting or when additional funds are needed.)

The Friends are also wondering the status of the \$18,000.00 FY26 Budget Amendment request to the City Council.

Their next meeting will be November 11, 2025 at 2:00 pm.

Notes from September 9, 2025 meeting

Members of the JKPL Fundraising and Marketing Committee met at 5:00 pm on Tuesday, September 9, 2025. Participants were Alex Wiezorek, Beth Gudenkauf, and Shirley Vonderhaar. Monika Steffen shared some thoughts via email.

Wreath-it-up Fundraiser: This event started September 1 with the Silent Auction scheduled to run October 20 – November 23. The Donor Reception and start of voting for ribbons will be on Sunday, October 26. The Silent auction ends at 3:00 pm on Sunday, November 23. Alex and Shirley will plan to work the closing. As of 9/9, four completed wreaths have been received and three have been picked up to create.

Blind Date with a Book Fundraiser: Beth will take the lead for this new fundraiser. She will select new or gently used books from the Book Sale area. They will be packaged with a drink beverage packet (apple cider, cocoa, tea, etc.), stickers, and possibly other related themed items and wrapped together into an attractive package. A description of the book (no title) is attached to the outside and the package is sold. Beth is hoping to have these at the September Downtown Market but is not available to work that event on September 27 so an alternative volunteer is requested.

Puzzle Fundraiser: A Fit the Pieces Puzzle Fundraiser has been scheduled for Thursday, October 23 from 5 to 8 pm at Textile Brewing Company. Teams of up to 4 members may buy a table for \$60.00 and will compete to complete a 500-piece puzzle. Textile will donate prizes for first and second place and donate 10% of food and drink sales during the event to the JKPL. Tickets are available to purchase at the JKPL and 15 tables are available. As of 9/8, 1 table has been sold. The committee selected a fall themed puzzle from Amazon and Shirley will order fifteen. The committee agreed to keep the twists and activities the same – assuming there will be enough volunteers. Volunteers will be confirmed in early October. The winter puzzle fundraiser at Textile will be scheduled after this one is complete. Alex will do a video interview with Paul, to be shared on social media, to promote this event.

Fall / Halloween Themed Event at O So Good: At the time of the meeting, Shirley reported she had a meeting scheduled with Lee and Kari Ostwinkle to discuss this fall event. Since that time, she has reported back via email that the event will be held on Friday, October 24 following all the same procedures and prices as previous events. Tickets will be \$120 for a table for up to six guests. Price includes two bottles of wine of your choice (or equal value in other drinks), a charcuterie board for six, and a dessert to share. There will be Halloween themed questions as well as general trivia and the contest will include some special twists, prizes, and giveaways. Costumes are encouraged and there will be a prize for the best individual costume as well as the best group / table costume. Guests are welcome to arrive at any time but trivia will begin promptly at 7:00 pm. Dollar Fresh is donating a \$200 gift card to help with expenses. Paul will do a video interview, perhaps at O So Good, to be shared on social media to promote this event.

Layette Quilt Display and Sale: This annual partnership is held in November and December. The Layette Ladies bring in a variety of quilts that are displayed in the magazine room. These quilts are available to purchase starting at \$25.00 (larger sizes are more) and proceeds are split between the Layette Ladies group and the JKPL (JKPL gets \$10.00 for each sold, Layette group get the remainder.) Shirley will reach out to the group to schedule this event for between Thanksgiving and Christmas. Shirley was also directed to ask if the group would be interested in hosting a program on quilting to help grow interest.

Breakfast Burrito Grab and Go Fundraiser: The fall event is scheduled for Small Business / Shop Local Saturday — Saturday, November 29 from 9 to 11 am. Fareway has agreed to partner and donate ingredients. Shirley will review what was needed at the spring event and provide a list for the Committee to review before sharing the list with Bill at Fareway. We will be adding a bowl option and will discuss pricing and other details at the next meeting.

Cookie Walk Fundraiser: This annual event will be December 5-7 this year. Hours will be Friday from 1 to 5 and Saturday 9 to 4 at the JKPL. Sunday will be a work day for clean-up and plating for gifts and sales. Anyone wanting to purchase cookies on Sunday will be able to select from those already plated. Prices will again be \$8.00 per dozen or \$15 for 2 dozen. The Merry Mingle Market (Downtown Winter Market) has been scheduled for Saturday, December 6 with the vendor market being from 12 to 4 pm, and a lighted parade at 6 pm. The Committee agreed we will again take plated and individual cookies and hot cocoa to the Downtown Market to sell. Prices at the market will be plated - \$8, individual cookies - \$1, and hot chocolate - \$2 per cup. Extra cookies will be plated and available to purchase the week following the event and also taken as thank you gifts to community partners. The committee noted we will need several volunteers, especially on Saturday as we will be selling both at the JKPL and at the Market.

Supper with Santa: Beth reported that Santa will be sponsored by The English Pub this year and they will manage their time so there was no need for the JKPL to be involved. Since we will not be adding this event, the Committee will likely recommend the library close at 4 pm, when the Market closes, as we did last year.

Soup Lunch and Supper: This annual event is scheduled for Monday, January 12, 2026. All Board and Fundraising members are asked to donate at least 4 or 5 quarts (ice cream tub) of either chicken noodle soup or chili for this fundraiser. Library staff, volunteers, and past board and committee members also donate. Other items are either purchased or donated. This carry out event is held for lunch and dinner: $11:30 \, \text{am} - 1:00 \, \text{pm} \, \& \, 4:30 - 6:30 \, \text{pm}$. Volunteers and other details will be decided in November or December.

Love My Library Giving Tree / Direct Mail: This event is traditionally held in January and February, but there has been discussion about changing the process — who is mailed to, size, etc. The committee agreed that direct mail has a lot of potential but there are details that need to be worked out. The committee will schedule a meeting in October to focus on this topic and want to be sure Danelle is available so she can share her expertise.

2026 Mystery Dinner: This event is scheduled for Saturday, February 28 with a snow date of March 7. Confirmed with Social Center, Brew Ha Ha and J & D Catering. Brew Ha Ha has indicated that their Roaring 20s show, *Murder at the Fish Fly Club*, is the only option available this time due to scheduling conflicts with one of the players. Monika suggested the Dyersville Sportsman Club as a possible partner for the meal due to the theme. The committee will follow up on this at their next meeting.

Art / Décor Event: This activity was on the schedule for FY25 as a late winter / early spring event featuring baseball or other sports décor but no event was scheduled. The committee agreed to keep it on the schedule as a potential activity, perhaps a partnership with the Field of Dreams / Events Center or Dug Out. No one expressed interest in taking on this event at this time so the Committee will discuss at a future meeting.

Fundraising Partnerships: As part of the discussion on the Puzzle events, committee members noted that Fuse would like to continue to partner with the JKPL – but might be interested in other activities. The English Pub is also interested in partnering for events after they open. Two new ideas that were brought were a Case Files event (solving a mystery) and a Casino Night. Due to the number of events already scheduled for the fall, the committee will discuss options for winter / spring activities at a future meeting.

2025 United for Libraries Virtual Training: Shirley and Beth had nothing new to share.

MARKETING:

FY26 Marketing Activities Calendar (tentative): The Calendar was reviewed and edited. An updated version will be emailed to the Committee and shared with the JKPL Board at their October meeting.

Book Bike: The Book Bike is scheduled to be out in September to the markets; and October for Books for Treats and other Halloween themed events as well as randomly for National Book Month – as weather and work schedules permit. We are still looking for a good location to store the bike. Hopefully Mick will allow the city to store it over the winter – but if anyone has ideas for year-round accessible storage, please share.

Radio Interview: Beth will do an interview at KDST on 9/25 to talk about the fall fundraisers: Wreath-it-up; Fit the Pieces at Textile Brewing; and Halloween Trivia at O So Good. She will also schedule another one for November to promote the Burrito Fundraiser and Cookie Walk activities.

Annual Report: Shirley shared a draft of the Annual Report that was color matched to the JKPL logo. The Committee noted that it wasn't a significant change but would be fine to use the matched version. Shirley reported that the City will likely be closing the FY25 financials in late September so she was hoping to have a proposed Annual Report for the Committee to review before the October JKPL Board meeting. Alex will also have an updated Message from the Board President to include.

Float for Christmas Lighted Parade: Alycia will put something together for the 2025 parade, using the book she created last year. She has asked if there is a place to store the foam book as they need the space in their garage. She said is light so we could potentially store in library basement – but size is awkward. Put together it is 8' x 6' or 8' x 4'; when in pieces (as it is now) it would be 3' x 4' and 2 to 2.5 feet high. The committee thought we should be able to store this in the basement so Shirley will contact Alycia to see when she might to bring it in.

Marketing Survey: The Committee will discuss the possibility of conducting a survey to find out the best way(s) to share information with the community at a future meeting.

Social Media Video: As part of the discussion about utilization of fundraising income at the August meeting, committee members noted that the public likely does not know how services like Hoopla work. It was suggested that a Board member should work with library staff to create and post a video on social media to explain more about these services. Alex is willing to do this but suggests staff create a script of some kind. Shirley will talk to Paul and come up with a plan.

Agenda for October 13, 2025 meeting

Members of the JKPL Fundraising and Marketing Committee met at 5:00 pm on Tuesday, September 9, 2025. Participants were Alex Wiezorek, Beth Gudenkauf, Monika Steffen, Danelle Schroeder and Shirley Vonderhaar.

Wreath-it-up Fundraiser: This annual event started September 1 with people donating wreath and other décor items. The Silent Auction will run October 20 – November 23. Based on email discussion, a "Buy It Now" option for Halloween Wreaths was added. Shirley spoke with the donors to get a value to create the "Buy It Now" price and received their permission before offering this option.

The Donor Reception and start of voting for ribbons will be on Sunday, October 26. Categories for voting in the JKPL will be Best Overall, Most Creative and Best Seasonal. Shirley will investigate options to include sold items in the voting – potentially posting pictures as an alternative. New this year we are adding a "Most Liked" so people can vote for their favorite on Facebook. The Silent Auction ends at 3:00 pm on Sunday, November 23. Alex and Shirley will work the closing. Twenty-six completed items have been received and ten were marked for "Buy It Now" with prices ranging from \$25 to \$50. Two wreaths have been purchased. Additional items should be arriving to be included in the silent auction.

Blind Date with a Book Fundraiser: Beth took the lead on this and reports that she has about 40 books ready to be wrapped and sold. She was unable to sell them at the September Downtown Market so the discussion was how to offer them to the community. There was also discussion on what, if anything, to include with the books. The committee agreed to add library themed bookmarks and / or oversized paperclips along with the hot beverage packets. Beth and Danelle will work together to wrap, decorate and label the books. Beth will display some at Ideal Decorating. Books will also be available to purchase at the Burrito Breakfast fundraiser in November and the Merry Mingle Downtown Market in December.

Puzzle Fundraiser: A Fit the Pieces Puzzle Fundraiser has been scheduled for Thursday, October 23 from 5 to 8 pm at Textile Brewing Company. Teams of up to 4 members may buy a table for \$60.00 and will compete to complete a 500-piece puzzle. Textile will donate prizes for first and second place and donate 10% of food and drink sales during the event to the JKPL. Tickets are available to purchase at the JKPL and 15 tables are available. Thirteen of the fifteen available tables have been sold. Fifteen copies of the selected puzzle were ordered and received. Alex will MC and volunteers are needed to help with set up, sign people in and manage twists during the event, and clean up. Danelle is planning to work and Catherine and Pat O'Hea have also volunteered. The committee will confirm volunteers at the October Board meeting and review / finalize twists during that meeting. Shirley will send out an email reminder to all teams the week of the event (10/20/25). The committee also noted that the community as a whole should be alerted that 10% of food and drink sales during the event would be donated to the JKPL – so those not participating in the puzzle event could support the library with their purchases, including carry out.

Fall / Halloween Trivia Event at O So Good: This annual event / partnership with O So Good Winery and Distillery is scheduled for Friday, October 24 following all the same procedures and prices as previous events. Tickets will be \$120 for a table for up to six guests. Price includes two bottles of wine of your choice (or equal value in other drinks), a charcuterie board for six, and a dessert to share. There will be Halloween themed questions as well as general trivia and the contest will include some special twists, prizes, and giveaways. Costumes are encouraged and there will be a prize for the best individual costume as well as the best group / table costume. Guests are welcome to arrive at any time but trivia

will begin promptly at 7:00 pm. Dollar Fresh has donated a \$200 gift card to help with expenses. As of 10/10/25, 5 tables have been sold. Deadline for sales is 10/21 to allow time to purchase ingredients for charcuterie boards. Shirley will put together library swag baskets for prizes and O So Good will donate prizes as well. Shirley will look at past participants and send out emails inviting them to join again this year.

Layette Quilt Display and Sale: This event is typically held annually in November and December. The Layette Ladies bring in a variety of quilts that are displayed in the magazine room. These quilts are available to purchase starting at \$25.00 (larger sizes are more) and proceeds are split between the Layette Ladies group and the JKPL. JKPL gets \$10.00 for each sold, Layette group get the remainder. The committee discussed ways to get more sales and involvement and suggested the JKPL could host a program on quilting, making a quilt square, sewing or something related, presented by the Layette Group members or other quilters in the community, to help grow interest. This idea will be investigated further and the schedule for displaying and selling quilts may be adjusted based on those plans.

Breakfast Burrito Grab and Go Fundraiser: This event is scheduled for Small Business / Shop Local Saturday - November 29 from 9 to 11 am. Fareway has agreed to partner again and will donated the following ingredients and supplies:

- 100 burrito size (10 to 12 in) tortillas;
- 9 dozen eggs .
- 35 cups of frozen hash browns
- 15 lbs. of ground pork sausage or Italian sausage
- 4 large jars of mild salsa
- 25 cups of Mexican style or mixed cheddar and jack shredded cheese
- cooking oil
- 6 9x13 inch foil pans
- foil sheets (need 100 / larger size)

Based on notes from the spring event and email responses from the committee, nacho cheese was not requested: Shirley noted the library has some bowls (no lids) available so we didn't include that in request. The bowls on hand will be covered with a foil sheet this year. If bowls are popular, providing an option that has a cover will be part of the discussion for the spring event. A sign thanking Fareway should be posted at the sale table and the Sandwich Boards will be put out during the Event.

The committee decided on a price of \$8.00 per burrito – an increase of \$1.00. Alex will cook on his Blackstone outside and sales will take place in the Hoffman Room. Alex started cooking about 7 am and additional workers were scheduled to start at 8 am. Sausage, eggs, hash browns, and cheese will all be mixed together in one roaster, after cooking, as burritos get those items equally. This should be more efficient. Salsa is the only additional item and will be added upon request. Workers will be needed to take money, fill tortillas (or bowl), roll tortillas, and add salsa/cover bowl. Two tables with 4 chairs each will be set up for those wanting to eat onsite. Pitchers of water, disposable cups and flatware will also be provided.

Cookie Walk Fundraiser: This annual event will be December 5-7 this year. Hours will be Friday from 1 to 5 and Saturday 9 to 3 at the JKPL. Sunday will be a work day for clean-up and plating for gifts and sales. Anyone wanting to purchase cookies on Sunday will be able to select from those already plated. Prices will again be \$8.00 per dozen or \$15 for 2 dozen. The Merry Mingle Market (Downtown Winter

Market) has been scheduled for Saturday, December 6 with the vendor market being from 12 to 4 pm, and a lighted parade at 6 pm. The Committee agreed we will again take plated and individual cookies and hot cocoa to the Downtown Market to sell. Prices at the market will be plated - \$8, individual cookies - \$1, and hot chocolate - \$2 per cup. Extra cookies will be plated and available to purchase the week following the event and also taken as thank you gifts to community partners. After discussion, the Committee decided there was no reason for the library to stay open late on Saturday so the library will close at its normal time of 3:00 pm. Shirley reported that Christa had decided to move the children's winter holiday activities to the Market location during the afternoon and the Pop-up Library will also be set up. We will need two library locations and canopies – one for the pop-up library and children's activities and one for the fundraising activities.

Several volunteers will be needed. Beth and Danelle will manage the Market activities of selling cookies, hot cocoa and books (Blind Date with a Book). Beth volunteered her husband to run cookies and / or cocoa from the library as needed. Workers will be needed at the library on Friday, December 5 from 1 to 5 pm, Saturday, December 6 from 9 am to 3 pm and Sunday, December 7 from 1 to 4 pm (or until everything is plated and cleaned up). Staff and volunteers will start contacting past donors the first week of November. Based on past events, we are estimating we need about 300 dozen items donated. Shirley will also check on supplies.

Soup Lunch and Supper: This annual event is scheduled for Monday, January 12, 2026. All Board and Fundraising members are asked to donate at least 4 or 5 quarts (ice cream tub) of either chicken nooḍle soup or chili for this fundraiser. Library staff, volunteers, and past board and committee members also donate. Other items are either purchased or donated. This carry out event is held for lunch and dinner: 11:30am -1:00 pm & 4:30-6:30 pm. More details for donors and volunteers will be discussed at the next meeting.

Love My Library Giving Tree / Direct Mail: This annual activity is traditionally held in January and February. In 2025 we sent mail to every Dyersville household that received a water bill, list provided by the City. We spent more money and raised more — but not as much as might have expected based on increased volume. There was also increase in participation in Build-a-basket which may be attributed to this; and our hope was that every household receiving the letter might bring more people into the library — even if they didn't donate. The committee will meet on Tuesday, October 28 at 6 pm to work on logistics and planning details for this activity.

2026 Mystery Dinner: This event is scheduled for Saturday, February 28 with a snow date of March 7. Confirmed with Social Center, Brew Ha Ha and J & D Catering. Brew Ha Ha will perform their Roaring 20s show, *Murder at the Fish Fly Club*. Shirley will get a price list from J & D Mart so committee can decide on menu and finalize pricing details.

Fundraising Partnerships: As part of the discussion on the Puzzle events, committee members noted that Fuse would like to continue to partner with the JKPL – but might be interested in other activities. The Committee discussed a Minute to Win It style event. Monika will reach out to Fuse to see if they have any ideas on what they might like to do. The English Pub is also interested in partnering for events at some point in the future. The committee will follow up with them in the spring.

2025 United for Libraries Virtual Training: Nothing new to add at this time.

MARKETING:

Radio Interviews: The committee would like an interview scheduled for the week of November 10th. Beth will go and is available any day except 11/11. She will take two coupons for free burritos for the station to give away and focus on the Wreath-it-up, Blind Date with a Book, Burrito and Cookie Walk / Merry Mingle Market events. Another interview should be scheduled to promote the Soup / Winter Events.

Annual Report: A preliminary draft of the FY25 Annual Report was shared with the Committee. The committee agreed to keep the value for collection use and live program attendance unchanged. Monika did a quick online search and the committee agreed that the value for passive programs and take and make kits should also be included on the report. The committee also discussed adding information on the value of the volunteer hours and pulling out downloadable audiobook use specifically. Shirley will share this with Dawn as she updates the report. The committee also suggested that specific details about return on investment and details on use and value could be shared on social media.

Float for Christmas Lighted Parade: Last year Alycia put together the JKPL Float for the December lighted parade. Shirley reached out to her to confirm her interest any availability this year. Alycia responded that she needed to consider if she had enough time and also that, if she did, she would need help. We will discuss options at the October Board meeting.

Marketing Survey: At a previous meeting, the Committee briefly discussed the benefit of conducting a survey to find out the best way(s) to share information with the community. The committee wondered if we could add a question about this on the library card registration form. They were also more open to using the ILS (library circulation system) to send emails and texts to patrons. Shirley will talk to Dawn about options, as she manages the ILS and is also in charge of most marketing efforts, and report back at a future meeting.

Realia (Games, Puzzles, DVDs, etc.) Circulation Policy

The James Kennedy Public Library has a collection of realia, including but not limited to, board, console, outdoor, and life-size games; puzzles, DVDs, Blu-rays, etc. for public use. Most of these materials may be used within the library, or checked out for use at home. The following rules apply:

- 1. Any library card holder may check out these materials.
- 2. The loan period for these materials is one (1) week.
- 3. Larger or specialty items such as board games, outdoor games, puppets and puzzles should be returned to a staff member at the circulation desk. Console games, DVDs, and Blu-rays may be returned in the audiovisual materials drop box or at the circulation desk. The patron is responsible for any damages to the materials as a result of being returned in the wrong location.
- 4. The patron is responsible for the return of the items in good condition. In case of loss, theft, or damage, the patron will be charged full replacement cost, plus a \$5.00 processing fee.
- 5. Reservations and renewals will be allowed per general library policies. Additional limits may be placed if demand or collection size warrants:
- 6. The James Kennedy Public Library assumes no responsibility for damage to the borrowers' equipment.
- 7. The library reserves the right to deny service to any patron who does not comply with these policies.

Please Note:

The library hopes that all pieces and parts of games and puzzles are included at the time of check out and will periodically check all items for contents. If an item is checked out with parts missing, patrons are encouraged to inform staff so they can rectify the problem.
