Requirements to get a pass:

Update from the Friends of the JKPL

The Friends met on May 6, 2019 at 10:00 am.

They reviewed the minutes and clarified that they had approved \$2500 for children's programming at the previous meeting, which included the amounts specifically requested by Kim Benton-Hermsen and an additional \$197 to cover the items Kim had indicated that she was planning to donate.

Current balance in their checking account is \$14,395 with an additional \$11,048 in a CD. The CD matures in May and the Friends decided to reinvest for 18 months with a 2.40% interest rate.

Currently there are 23 golden members, 8 business members, 92 family members and 58 single members for a total of 181. In addition to the \$2520 from dues, the membership mailing brought in \$1565 in donations.

Shirley requested the Friends consider funding a program on the Hersey Chocolate Company scheduled for September 15, 2019 at a cost of \$320.00. This was approved.

The July used book sale was scheduled for July 18 – 22 with the following hours: Thursday, July 18 from 4 to 8 pm; Friday, July 19 from 9am to 5pm, Saturday, July 20 from 9am to 1pm, and Monday, July 22 from 9am to 7pm.

There was extensive discussion of the volume of books that are stored in the basement for the sale and options to reduce this backlog, especially since Better World Books will no long accept books from us, effective 5/31/19. Some members suggested that the Friends stop accepting donated books and just sell those culled from the library; others felt that the items should be reviewed more frequently and those less likely to sell be disposed of rather than stored. Shirley noted that that all items donated that weren't of use to the library but that Miriam felt were sellable, were taken to the basement, along with the culled books from the library that were in usable condition. She understood that everything should go through at least one sale. If that wasn't an expectation, the volume of books stored could be reduced by donating to other locations without having been offered in a sale. Since these items belong to the Friends, not the library, they can be disposed of however the Friends choose. Carol, Sharon and Shirley will work together to reduce the donated and culled items stored in the basement.

There was also discussion regarding the amount of work the used book sales require and the amount of money they raise. General opinions were that people are purchasing fewer print books because they are reading on devices.

The Circa 21 Bus Trip to see *Singin'* in the *Rain* is scheduled for Wednesday, October 16, 2019. Because price for both the tickets and the transportation has increased, the Friends decided to adjust the ticket prices to \$93.00 per person. The library will facilitate sale of tickets as they did last year as it worked very smoothly. Tickets will be available starting 5/8/19 and there will be no reservations. This year's event will include a stop at Rhythm City Casino.

The Friends set the date for their next meeting for Tuesday, June 18. This will be both a meeting and a work date to prepare for the book sale so the meeting will start at 9:00 am.

Notes from Wednesday, May 1, 2019 Fundraising Committee meeting

The Fundraising Committee of the JKPL met on Wednesday, May 1, 2019 at 5:30 pm. Present were Chairperson Mary Jane Meade, members Karen Kramer, Brenda Ingles, and Catherine O'Hea, and Library Director Shirley Vonderhaar.

Build-a-Basket: 41 Baskets were donated and proceeds were \$1869 – our best year ever. No changes suggested for next year, just hope to again have the quality and quantity of donations.

Wine and Beer Tasting: Was held Friday, April 26 from 5 to 8 pm. Sales were \$1200. Value of glasses taken was \$313 so our proceeds from this event were \$887. Only additional expense would be the FB boosting for marketing.

Based on number of glasses taken, attendance was 64. This matches with sales and donations (64×20 is \$1280; donated 4 tickets). Although we always talk about wanting more attendees, this was a good size for the venue. There was some discussion with Becca Miller (Brew and Brew owner) about potentially putting out fewer tables for guests to help with crowding. The committee also discussed ways we can encourage people to leave at the end of the event as it was after 9:00 pm before Becca could lock up for the night.

Vendors this year were Textile Brewing (Dyersville), Franklin Street (Manchester), Dimensional (Dubuque), O So Good (Dyersville) and Dubuque Heritage (Dubuque). Promise Land donated 4 bottles of wine and Mary Jane poured for them. Having small and local was a nice fit so committee thought it would be good to continue with this focus. For 2020 we will contact Textile Brewing, Franklin Street, Dimensional, O So Good, Dubuque Heritage, and Jennings (said to contact them next year) as soon as we confirm our date in January to see if they are interested and available. After that we will reach out to other potential vendors until our 6 spaces are filled. Ideally we will have 3 breweries and 3 wineries participating.

We purchased 144 Belgium beer glasses (4Imprint donated 5 additional in case of breakage) so we had a total of 149 available. Cost was \$728.10 (included 2 imprints and shipping) so \$4.89 per glass. This company was so easy to work with and the quality was better; although cost was more than previous years'. We have 85 glasses left which would be enough for next year. After discussion the committee agreed to offer these glasses for sale for \$10.00 each and if necessary order more before the 2020 event.

Pat and Catherine O'Hea handled the 50/50 raffle. Tickets were 1 for \$2.00; 3 for \$5.00 and 10 for \$10.00 Sold \$214, so proceeds were \$107.

Lisa Christopher created beautiful decorations for us. We had opted not to do door prizes this year and neglected to tell people they could take at the end so we have several left. They would hold up for next year if we want to save. Shirley will check with Lisa to see if she wants us to save; if not we will use for library decorations or for prizes.

Because our cost for glasses was higher and we haven't changed the price for attendance for several years, the committee discussed whether we should change the price or consider charging more at the door, for example \$20 in advance, \$25 at the door. The committee will discuss again in the spring and make a decision at that time.

Appetizers seemed sufficient without a lot of leftovers. Fareway donated 3 meat and cheese trays. Two were used, and almost all the cheese was gone from both. The third was not put out. Since these don't keep well, a committee member donated and took the full tray and another member donated and took the leftover meat and cheese from the first two. The meatballs were donated by Brenda and those left were frozen to be used at the staff meeting in May. Karen and Shirley purchased and donated the spinach dip. It was all gone. Shirley said she might look for alternatives for next year (making vs. purchasing). Brew and Brew made and donated chocolate covered strawberries for the sweet. They were yummy and popular. Mary Jane donated two containers of pub mix to put out on the tables. Less than one container was left when cleaning up. Leftovers will be used at library programs. The flawed beer glasses from previous events were used to serve and that worked well. Napkins were donated by American Trust and the small plates were donated by Catherine. There were some left, which will be used by the library for events.

Marketing for this event included the regular activities (posters, PSAs, etc.) as well as donating 2 tickets to Woman's Night and 2 tickets to KDST to be given away in drawings. It was also included on the bank marque and boosted on Facebook.

Plant Sale Fundraiser: This event is scheduled for Saturday, May 18 from 8 to 10 am. Brenda's husband will bring a flatbed and her donated plant either late on Friday or before 7:30 am on Saturday. Shirley will bring a canopy and weights from home. Lynn Osterhaus will bring us money aprons to use for sales. Posters will go out the first week of May encouraging donations and purchases. Mary Jane, Catherine and Shirley believe they can work 7:30 to 10; Karen will work 7:30 to 8:30 and come back when she is available. As in the past, things will be priced at \$1.00 to \$5.00 with donations welcome. After 10:00 am, anything left will remain on the flatbed with a sign to bring a donation into the library for any items wanted.

Selling Candy at the Library: Shirley purchased two boxes of candy but library staff haven't started selling yet. This should get underway in the next week or so, with bars being sold for \$1.00 each.

Partnering with Restaurants: Nothing new at this time.

Making and Selling Greeting Cards and Book Marks: Nothing new at this time.

Boutique Crawl: Consensus of the committee is that this is too complicated to pursue at this time.

Downtown Friday Night: The committee talked about other easy ways to raise money for the library. The idea of selling treats of some kind at the DTFN events was suggested, as there doesn't seem to be a lot available. After discussion the committee decided to investigate selling the giant size freezer pops. Catherine will see how much they would cost to purchase from Fareway and how far in advance we would need to purchase and Shirley will contact the Chamber. If possible, the committee will plan this for the June 14 event and if it goes over well, do again in July and August. Additional planning and discussion will be held via email as needed.

Schedule Next meeting: Next meeting scheduled for Wednesday, June 5 at 5:30 pm.
