Notes from the October 2, 2017 Fundraising Committee Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm. In attendance were members Lynn Osterhaus, Mary Jane Meade, Brenda Ingles, and Shirley Vonderhaar. Jolene Pitzenberger-Timp, chairperson was excused.

Wreath-it-up Fundraiser: This event is underway with people being able to pick up and create their wreaths to donate. The silent auction begins October 16 and runs until November 12, 2017. The committee discussed the minimum bid for the wreaths and decided to keep it at \$5.00. Voting for the "best" wreaths runs from October 22 to November 5. The committee decided that the categories should be Most Creative, Best Overall, and Best Holiday or Seasonal - depending on what is donated. There was discussion of having a Best Made by a Youth category and Shirley will add that if we have several wreaths donated by those under 18. Upcoming events or activities connected with this fundraiser are the Donor reception on Sunday, October 22 from 2 to 4 pm, which is also the date the voting on the wreaths begins and the Silent Auction open house on Sunday, November 12 from 2 to 4 pm. The bidding ends promptly at 3:00 pm with volunteers needed to assist from 2:30 to 3:30 pm. Shirley, Brenda, Jolene and Mary Jane all thought they would be free to assist that day so should be fine with staffing.

Fall / Winter Quilt Raffle: Shirley reported she had spoken with Mary Jo Budan from the Layette group and they had agreed to run the event from November 13 to December 17. Members of the group will bring in 6 or so small quilts to put on display in the Periodicals room on the 13th and will come to take back the one that isn't selected by the winner after the 18th. Raffle tickets will again be 1 for \$2, 3 for \$5.00 and 10 for \$10.00.

Christmas Cookie Walk: This annual event is scheduled for Saturday, December 2, 2017 from 10 am to 1 pm. Library staff and volunteers will call Friends volunteers and past cookie walk donors during the first week of November asking them to donate 2 dozen (or more) homemade cookies or other sweet treats. All board members are encouraged to donate at least 2 dozen items. Supplies needed for this event are plates, basket bags, and bows. We do need more bows so Shirley will reach out to Jolene about making more. Lynn said she had ribbon to donate for this cause. Shirley will double check if more plates or bags are needed before the next meeting. The committee suggested that we only purchase clear or themes bags that are see thru rather than any colored bags.

Soup Supper: This event is scheduled for Thursday, January 18, 2018 from 5 to 8 pm. Board members are asked to donate a 4 or 5 quart ice cream tub of either chili or chicken noodle soup. Volunteers will be needed to work that evening serving the soup, taking money, etc. Committee members will discuss the specific needs for volunteers and supplies at their next meeting.

Mystery Dinner: This event is scheduled for Saturday, February 24 at the Dyersville Golf and Country Club. J & D will cater and the committee will discuss the menu at their next meeting. Shirley will get a list of options from J & D and ask if there is anything new they would like to suggest. Die Laughing will perform their new 1960s era show A *Dinner to Die For*. It looks like we will be the debut performance so we should use that in marketing this special event.

The committee confirmed that tickets will again be \$50.00 or \$350.00 for a table. We will start officially marketing this event in November, including sending out invitations to those who purchased tables in the past so that they could be sure to keep that date open on their calendar if they wanted to come again. It was decided to have the tickets printed and available by November 1 in case people wanted to

purchase them early. We hold the checks / payments until the event occurs in case we cancel and need to refund the money. Shirley thought someone had said that O So Good had offered to donate wine for this event so she will check with O So Good Winery to see if they were interested in donating wine for the first 30 tickets sold. If not, the committee thought we should ask the board for donations as that is how we have filled this need in the past.

Build-a-Basket: The committee discussed the schedule for the annual Build-a-Basket fundraiser. At the last meeting the decision was made that this event does not have to be completed before Easter as we had been doing in the past and that we should look at previous years and decide on a regular annual schedule. Looking at the past 5 years, the committee decided to have this event start on February 1 and we would schedule the rest of it accordingly. While there was some concern that we not start it at the same time as the Love My Library campaign, which kicks off with the Soup Supper (typically the 3rd Thursday of January), there is also some benefit to having them overlapping as we can talk about both in our letter to local businesses that goes out in January. Also some businesses might be able to participate in one and not the other so offering both options at the same time seems a positive. Individuals and organizations are also welcome to participate and can choose to do one or both.

Coloring Book Sales: Since the coloring books have not been available for a full year yet and were offered late in the 2017 holiday season, we will continue to sell theme for \$10.00 for the rest of 2017 and do some promoting and marketing before the holidays. If the marketing committee has any advice on this, we are interested in hearing from them. We will discuss reducing the price in 2018 and will continue to use as prizes and incentives.

Roshek Holiday Nonprofit Silent Auction: The committee decided that this event was unlikely to bring in significant revenue so likely wasn't worth the time to put something together. We are going to pass on being involved in this and not discuss again unless there is a change in our needs.

Local writers book as fundraiser: A patron suggested, since we have the writing group, Lifelong learners group, NaNoWriMo, etc. that we should consider putting together a collection of stories, poems, etc. submitted by local authors and selling that as a fundraiser. The committee discussed this recommendation and felt this activity did not really lend itself to being a fundraiser but was more or a community event or a program activity for the individual groups to consider.

Charity Fundraising Organization: Shirley forwarded an email I received from this organization and brought in a catalog that shows their products. The committee is not interested in this kind of event.

Future planning: The committee brainstormed ideas for additional fundraising activities and each committee member is asked to think about potential fundraising events or activities that we could consider offering and bring 3 or 4 ideas to the next meeting for discussion.

Schedule Next meeting: The next meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 6, 2017 at 5:45 pm.

Notes from Furnishings, Art & Facilities Committee meeting on October 4, 2017

The Furnishings Art and Facilities Committee met on Wednesday, October 4, 2017 at 5:30 pm. Present were Mike Mullis, Jolene Pitzenberger-Timp, Betty Anne Scherrman and Shirley Vonderhaar. Barb Heitzman was excused.

The purpose of this meeting was to look at the library floor plan and discuss ideas for space for the Smart Spaces project. Shirley shared an enlarged copy of the library map that Steve put together a few years ago and the group looked at the space and discussed options for the smart / active learning space as well as other physical space reorganization. The consensus of the group was that if we were going to be moving some things around or removing others, it made sense to look at how that effected other areas and what other needs the library might have, even if they weren't tied directly to this active learning space. The recommendations of the committee for each of these areas are below.

Active Learning Space: This space will be located in the back area of the library taking over where there are two library tables currently placed and removing, relocating or repurposing one or two lengths of shelving. This will allow the space to be readily accessible and viewable when entering the library and from the circulation desk but should also mitigate sound issues. Shirley will investigate what square footage is needed to provide active learning space for 15 to 20 individuals in various configurations and utilize this in deciding how much physical space needs to be carved out of this area. The committee was very interested in the idea of putting in a loft or mezzanine area but was concerned that this is a longer term project and should involve the city (as could be a change in the structure of the building), architect, contractors, etc. The committee discussed whether the larger project was something we should pursue now or wait and see how the active learning space was used and use that information as justification for the internal expansion. The committee decided this should be a question for the Board as a whole to discuss at their October board meeting. The committee also discussed flooring options as the active learning space might be better with something other than carpet but carpet is the best option for sound control. Since the carpet as a whole is showing signs of wear the committee decided to leave the carpet as it in the active learning space and consider changing the flooring when the carpet is scheduled for replacement.

Teen Space: The committee discussed the fact that the active learning space will take over and lead into what is currently considered the teen space against the back wall. Shirley reported that she and Paul had discussed the fact that the teen space doesn't really lend itself to be used by the teens because of its current layout and suggested that we move the teen materials into the corner where the science fiction and fantasy materials are located and create a teen corner, possibly removing or relocating the shelves where the paranormal are located and putting in a pub table or two for the teens to use. The committee liked this idea. While this is not part of the Smart Spaces project it makes sense to do this at the same time we are reorganizing the physical space.

Quiet Space: When we started this project, Shirley's original thought was to put this active learning space in the genealogy room as that space is underutilized and used as storage. As the project progressed, that option became less than ideal because of the expectation to have the active learning

space visible and readily available. The concern for having a quiet space in the library did come up a couple of times during this process and the idea of changing the genealogy room into a quiet space seems like a good option. There is no way to make the front desk, periodicals, computer area quiet as those places require conversations. However the genealogy room is separated by walls and somewhat isolated so would be a good space for people wanting to read quietly, study, use with a laptop (their own or borrowed from the library), etc. The committee concluded that this would be a good use of the space and, although this reorganization is not part of the Smart Space project specifically, it lends itself to happening at the same time.

Shirley will put together a potential new library floor plan based on these discussions and do some research on space needs for active learning for groups of 15 to 20. The action plan, including budget, for the Small Libraries Create Smart Spaces project is due October 19 so Shirley will put together a budget plan that can be used in whatever space we approve. The implementation deadline for the Smart Spaces project is March 31, 2018.

Things for the Board to consider:

- 1. What do you think about the idea of a loft or mezzanine area above or part of the Smart Learning Space? Should we investigate this now or wait and see?
- 2. What time-line should we look at for replacing the carpet in the library? Do we want to do this in conjunction with the Smart Spaces project since we will be moving things around?

1. Use of social media to market the library

Paul joined the committee for a discussion about using video posts on the library's social media as another marketing tool. He had already been researching this as it is a growing trend. One of the types of posts we specifically discussed was to do weekly short videos highlighting new items that are available to borrow. Paul did the first video of this kind on September 26 where he highlighted 3 dvds and 3 books new to the collection.

We also talked with Paul about the cost of boosting Facebook/Twitter posts or creating ads on our social media. Both cost \$1 per day and the library can set how much money it wants to spend. The library can also specify for each boost or post specifics to target a particular audience. The difference between a boosted post and an ad is that a post can only be seen by those who already like the library's page and their friends. An ad will be seen by anyone who fits the target guidelines we select. The committee discussed that every fundraiser should have a boosted post/ad created for it and beyond that we can decide as events occur. Paul reached out to Carnegie-Stout and they told him they pay for boosts/posts when they have a large event or they are paying for a performer. Carnegie-Stout said that they calculated their return at about \$1 spent reaches 100 people.

2. KDST morning show interviews

Pat talked to KDST about participating in some of their on-air interviews and the first one is scheduled with Angela on October 4. The committee talked about the next interview should be to promote the Almost Sunrise/Veteran's Day showing on November 11.

3. Annual report format

Shirley asked the committee to review the format for the annual report before she gets started on the FY17 report. The committee said that they would like a week to look over the report in detail but the first reaction was that the colors are great, the information is great, but it's hard to read. It was discussed that perhaps the report could be set up in traditional columns or with a clear flow as to how the information should be read. One idea floated out there was to take the tagline and section up the annual report to the three parts of the tagline – Discover, Connect, Inspire. The committee agreed that it is nice to also have the bookmark version of the annual report as a companion to the full report. The committee will send along more feedback to Shirley once they have reviewed the report in detail.

4. Marketing brochure

The committee talked about the annual Spring & Summer insert in the Parks and Rec booklet and reviewed marketing flyers from other libraries as inspiration. It was decided that based on timing and the decline of the physical copy of the Parks and Rec booklets being printed, that

the library would discontinue putting an event insert in their booklet. However, the committee recommended that our library create a seasonal/quarterly insert instead that we print up and distribute in the library. This insert would cover 3-4 months of events rather than the Parks and Rec insert which often covered 6 months of events. This way the brochure could be tailored more towards the seasons. This also ties in to the decision by Shirley and Dawn that the librarians need to make an effort to plan events out 3 months ahead instead of planning programs month by month. It was agreed that Dawn would put one together for winter with the goal of it being printed by the end of November. We agreed this would be the tester to see how long it takes to create and the response we get and then we can determine if we need to tweak how it is handled.

5. 2018 schedule of events and planning for events Dawn updated the list of yearly events the library hosts so the committee could see all that we do. This list does not include regular monthly events. The point of this list is to give the committee framework of programs we do so we can decide if we want to do extra marketing for any of the events. Nothing was determined as of yet with the exception being that all fundraisers deserve extra marketing. To accomplish that we will offer our services to the Fundraising Committee should they want or need extra help when they host fundraisers.

6. Mousepads & rulers

Shirley had approached the committee to discuss the idea of purchasing mousepads branded with the library's information to use as prizes and promotional items. The committee preferred the idea of purchasing 6" die-cut rulers that have an image of a book on them to use as a promo item instead. These rulers could be imprinted with the library's logo and information. The committee found one they like from IdeaStage Promotional Items online. The cost would be \$.89-\$.94 per ruler depending on if the imprint is 1 color or 2 color. Dawn checked with Heritage Printing and they didn't have what we were looking for. We're still trying to finalize some details about the rulers before we commit to buying them.
