Want to learn about innovative approaches to library advocacy from lowa and nationwide? Join us for the 2018 edition of Innovative Libraries Online Conference!

Our morning keynote speaker is John Chrastka, founder and executive director of EveryLibrary, the first Super PAC for libraries. Since 2012, EveryLibrary has provided pro-bono support to 73 library communities with ballot measures and tax referendum, helping win well over \$255 million in stable tax funding. He is a former Board president of the Berwyn (IL) Public Library and RAILS, the Reaching Across Illinois Libraries System. Prior to EveryLibrary, he was a partner in AssociaDirect, an association consultancy, and was Director for Membership Development at ALA. He is a 2014 Library Journal Mover & Shaker.

In his keynote, From Stories to Action: How to talk about your budget in a way that activates support and secures the funding, John will discuss how to talk about your funding in a new way by talking about you, your staff and board, and why you do the work you do.

The evening keynote speaker is Lance Werner, the Director of the award winning Kent District Library (KDL), the second largest and busiest library in the State of Michigan. He has a JD degree from Michigan State University, College of Law and an MLIS from Wayne State University, and has worked as both an academic librarian and law librarian. He was named a 2016 Library Journal Mover & Shaker and is passionate about advocacy.

His session, *The Value of Personal Relationships in Advocacy*, will provide an overview about how personal relationships with elected officials can pay huge dividends in advocacy efforts. There will also be a discussion about various techniques that have been successfully used by Lance in creating genuine relationships with elected officials and other decision makers.

Presentations throughout the day will showcase the ways lowa librarians have put advocacy into action in their communities. Forging relationships with local schools, advocating for county funding through collaboration and shared projects, and garnering support for building projects are some examples of the outcomes the presenters have met through effective advocacy.

ILOC offers keynote speakers, sessions on a variety of topics, and an evening session designed for trustees. Come and go throughout the day, attending the sessions you're most interested in.
