The first is a PLACE Grant (Public Libraries Advancing Community Engagement: Environmental Literacy Through Climate Change Discussions) which is a book discussion / science café series similar to that we received two years ago. Second is the Small Libraries Create Smart Spaces grant. For this grant, 15 small public libraries (serving communities with fewer than 25,000 people) will be selected to receive instructional and material support to engage their communities in a space transformation process that supports active learning at the library. The second is very competitive and will require a 4 hour per week time commitment if received, but fits very closely with our strategic plan. Both should be announced in December.

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Notes Furnishings, Art and Facilities Committee Meeting – October 17, 2016

Members present: Chairperson Barb Heitzman, Mike Mullis and Shirley Vonderhaar. Jolene Pitzenberger-Timp and Betty Anne Scherrman were excused.

- *Countertops:* The laminate counters are installed and completed. Countertops Inc. contacted Shirley today and the Corian is ready so that should be going in shortly.
- Wooden furnishings: The committee agreed that the OPAC stands and the children's computer tables need to be refinished and that the estimate of \$125 per table from Chad Osterhaus was acceptable. Shirley will contact Chad to have him get started on this project and also talk to him about the possibility if a more durable finish.
- Stall dividers in the bathrooms: The dividers in the public bathrooms need to be replaced or sanded / repainted. The committee felt that replacing the dividers with a plastic product would be a better long term solution. Shirley will contact Becky Schwendinger to see if she can provide any insight into what Xavier installed during their recent construction project.
- Exterior door to Hoffman room: The exterior door from the Hoffman Room to the parking lot is showing areas of rust. The committee felt that sanding and repainting would solve this problem. Shirley will contact Charlie Goldsmith and Jay Their to see if they would like to provide an estimate for this project.
- Lighting: After looking at the lighting, the committee felt that we should get an estimate to change all of the library lighting to LED. Shirley will contact Terry Recker and ask him to put together an estimate for doing all of the high lighting fixtures first, and then also doing all of the fixtures so the committee can make an informed decision.
- Painting: The committee agreed that there will need to be some painting touch-ups at a
 minimum to address the areas where the laminate is being replaced. We will wait until all of
 the counters are replaced to make a decision on what areas we would like repainted.
- Library Walk Through: Because not all committee members were present, the committee decided to plan a library walk thru for a future meeting date.
- Capital Projects Budget Amendment: Shirley reported that she will be putting together a budget estimate for the facility projects already approved as well as for those under consideration, for the committee to review in the next several weeks.
