Notes from Finance Committee meeting:

Present were: Angela English, chair person; members Steve Werner, Joe Petche, Mary Radloff, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

Meeting was called to order at 4:05 pm on Monday, February 27, 2017.

FY18 Budget:

The JKPL Board had requested \$412,481.00 for the FY18 Library Operating Budget and the City Council allocated \$405,000.00. The committee discussed options for addressing this difference. The consensus was that the \$405,000.00 was not what we had hoped or needed but there are limited options for change so we need to revise our FY18 budget accordingly. The simplest place to reduce costs is materials and supplies but that is where we have been drawing from every time we have a shortfall. The committee felt we could not continue to do that and continue to provide the type of collection our community needs, however reducing personnel expenses likely means fewer hours open and / or for fewer programs. After discussion the Committee proposed the following modifications to the FY18 budget:

- 1. Reduce personnel budget for change in staffing (new librarian to be hired in March 2017): reduces wages & benefits by \$718.00
- 2. Reduce personnel budget by eliminating additional temporary circ / clerical staff hours for summer: reduces wages & benefits by \$1995.00
- 3. Reduce personnel budget by eliminating scheduled extra hours to cover time off: reduces wages & benefits by \$1800.00
- 4. Reduce supplies budget by \$1500.00
- 5. Reduce materials budget by the difference remaining (\$1127.00)

FY17 Budget:

The JKPL budget for FY17 needed to be reviewed and potentially revised or a budget amendment requested to adjust for the fact that a family insurance benefit is scheduled to be added as of 3/1/17. Shirley reported that, after revising the FY17 budget for the changes in staffing and insurance costs, she believed that the additional cost for family insurance could be absorbed within the existing budget. The committee accepted this assessment and Shirley will keep a close eye on the budget to make sure that we stay close to the funds allocated.

Enrich Iowa / Direct State Aid:

The committee talked briefly about the letter from the State Librarian regarding the potential reduction in funding for the Enrich lowa /Direct State Aid program. Consensus was there is no action needed at this time but that we should be alert to changes and consider cost / benefit for participation in this
