Notes from April 18, 217 meeting of the Fundraising Committee



Meeting was called to order at 5:30 pm. In attendance were Jolene Pitzenberger-Timp, chairperson; and members Lynn Osterhaus, Mary Jane Meade, Brenda Ingles, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

Mystery Dinner Theatre: Shirley reported that J & D Mart had scheduled us in for Saturday, February 10 with February 24, 2018 as a snow date. She has not heard back yet from Die Laughing or the Country Club to confirm their availability.

Build-a-Basket: The Build-a-basket fundraiser has concluded with proceeds being \$1389.00.

Wine & Beer Tasting: The Wine and Beer Tasting Fundraiser is scheduled for Friday, April 21, 2017 from 5 to 8 pm at Brew & Brew. Six vendors are participating: Wine: O So Good, PromiseLand and Stone Cliff and Beer: Franklin Street Brewery, 7G, Matthews. Becca's sister will pour for Matthews and Mary Jane will pour for PromiseLand if they are unable to staff their table.

Jolene will manage the 50/50 Raffle of selling playing cards for \$5.00 each. We will plan to sell one deck but have a second available if there is interest. Door prizes will be yard signs, coloring books, table decorations and any donations received from Matthews Distributing. The drawing for the prizes will be held somewhere between 7 and 7:30 pm and Jolene will handle this as well. Any prizes not picked up at the event will be taken to the library and the winners called on Saturday.

Brenda will make and donate meatballs. The library has tooth picks left from previous events to use for serving. Fareway will donate a large meat and cheese tray and crackers. This should be picked up after noon on Friday. Brew & Brew will provide hot spinach dip at cost and Mary Jane will pick up crackers to go with this dip. Brew & Brew will make and donate cupcakes as the sweet for the evening. Lynn donated a pub mix to go on the tables. Mary Jane provided small plates and we should be set for paper products.

Table decorations will be upcycled wine glasses. We will use flawed green stemmed wine glasses. Brenda donated electric tea lights and Lisa Christopher is making shades with her cricut machine. We are planning to have 12 and give them away in pairs as door prizes. The library will also bring down table coverings and pitchers to use for water and waste from rinsing.

Posters for this event went out on March 24 and April 1. KDST gave away 4 tickets over the radio and both the library and Brew & Brew gave away 1 ticket as a Facebook promotion. We requested this event to be announced on the bank marques. An insert was included in the April Chamber newsletter. One side was about the wine tasting and the other side was about the other upcoming fundraisers. Quarter size sheet fliers were taken to Chad's Pizza and Brew and Brew and also handed out at the library circulation desk.

Decorating and Set Up will start at 3:00 pm. Shirley, Paul and Becca will take the lead in getting the space set up. We will bring the sandwich board down and put up outside Brew & Brew to catch people's attention. Vendors are welcome to arrive and set up any time after 4 pm. A volunteer washed the wine / beer classes ahead of time so they should be ready to set out. Doors open to the public at 5:00 pm so we have two shifts for taking / selling tickets. Mary Anne Menke volunteered to work the first shift and Shirley will take over for the second shift. Pat Valant from the board offered to help where needed for the event so he can assist Brenda in supervising the refreshments if needed. Board and committee members who are available at 8:00 pm are encouraged to help with clean up.

Family Get-away Raffle: After discussion the committee decided to hold the Family Get-Away Raffle this year and evaluate it when deciding the schedule for FY18. Since it has already been advertised in some of the summer events

fliers and the requests for donations have already been sent out it made sense for us to hold. Also, Jolene is willing to sell tickets on June 9, the night of Down Town Friday Night, even if we don't have a special event and it was agreed that this evening of selling has a significant impact on revenue and whether it is successful. Because the tickets to Lost Island are popular, we will purchase 8 tickets as the reduced cost but this will be the only item we purchase. It was also agreed to include 2 coloring books with each destination as entertainment for the trip. The goal is to have 6 destinations available. The winners will be drawn on Saturday, June 10. Shirley also reported that the Vertical Jump Park in Dubuque had donated 4 one-hour passes. As part of this discussion Shirley reported that the library may decide to hold an event during DTFN as it is an opportunity to reach people who might not visit the library otherwise. Also, the timing might work well to be gathering data or sharing information about the Small Libraries Create Smart Spaces project.

Garden and Plant Sale: This event is scheduled for Saturday, May 20 from 8 to 10 am with set up starting at 7:00 am in city parking lot. Shirley noted that advance publicity had the time from 8 to 11 am so people working that day might be alert to late arrivals. Shirley will confirm with the city that the parking lot can be closed and Brenda will bring a flatbed to use for sales. Committee, Board, Staff, Volunteers, Friends, and Community members are invited to donate plants of all kinds, including house plants, to be sold. Prices will be \$2.00 to \$5.00 depending on the size of the plant. Jolene and Lynn both have aprons we can use and Shirley will make sure we have money available to make change. Jolene, Mary Jane, and Shirley are available to work. If anyone has plastic grocery bags they don't need, the library can use these for this event as well as another upcycling program.

Yard Sign Sales Fundraiser: Will continue to sell these for \$10.00 each during April and May.

Coloring Books: Are still available for \$10.00 each. Will use some of them for prizes for the summer reading programs and plan to promote more again in the fall.

Charging Station: Two years ago, EBSCO approached the library about providing a charging station in the library that would be sponsored by a local business. That two year contract is now up so we need to decide if we want to continue this partnership. Jayne Houselog was our original sponsor but will not be continuing. EBSCO will find the local partner so there is no work for the library in offering this service. The committee agreed it was a good service and that we should continue to participate.

Flawed Glasses: Jolene's students are removing the logos for us so we can repurpose. We may schedule a series of upcycling projects that can utilize these during the summer or fall.

Next Meeting: With spring and summer commitments it was agreed that the committee would not schedule a face to face meeting at this time but instead meet electronically for the next few months.
