Streaming Movies



Kanopy is an on-demand film streaming service that provides access to more than 30,000 of the world's best films, including documentaries, hard-to-find titles, film festival favorites, indie and classic films, and world cinema. Films can be streamed from any computer, television, mobile device or platform by downloading the Kanopy app for iOS, Android, AppleTV, Chromecast or Roku. The JKPL agreement provides 10 films per month per patron and resets on the 1st of each month. Once accessed, the film is available for viewing for 72 hours. There are two requirements to use Kanopy: First, you must have a JKPL library card. Second, use is limited to only those patrons who live within the Dyersville city limits, live in one of the cities that contract with the library for service, or anyone who has paid for a membership with the library.

eBooks, eAudiobooks, eMagazines



Borrow books, audiobooks, and magazines digitally and load them onto a portable device such as a tablet, eReader, or Smartphone. Patrons can download 3 books/audiobooks at a time. There are no limits on how many magazines you can check out and they do not count toward the 3 item limit. Any item borrowed from BRIDGES has a two week check-out period. There are two requirements to use BRIDES: First, you must have a JKPL library card. Second, use is limited to only those patrons who live within the Dyersville city limits, live in one of the cities that contract with the library for service, or anyone who has paid for a membership with the library

**If you live in Delaware or Dubuque County you can still borrow through BRIDGES but you must borrow using the library card from the library considered to be your "home" library. This would be the library in Manchester if you live in Delaware County and the Dubuque County Library System if you live in Dubuque County (not within Dubuque city limits).

Downloadable & Streaming Music



Download and stream music for free! Each patron can download 3 songs each week for free and they are yours to keep. You can even transfer them to a portable device. The week resets each Sunday at midnight. Or stream up to 5 hours of music per day to listen to. There are two requirements to use Freegal. First, you must have a JKPL library card. Meeting opened with no agenda – but used the minutes from previous meeting to review progress on action items and what further planning was needed.

Foundation Brochure was completed but State Farm had already turned in their printer. Tina Gulick at Heritage Printing donated time and materials instead. We have 150 completed brochures on hand and they will be stocked at the library for easy access to all. Each member took a few. Report of ILS Transition and Closing Library for Staff Training

Dawn Schrandt, Assistant Director, was assigned the task of reviewing and recommending an Integrated Library System (ILS) to meet the library needs. After study, she recommended that we switch our ILS to Atriuum by Book Systems, to which I concurred. Below is a report on the process:

Dawn looked at Koha, Atriuum, Apollo and made contact with Polaris, as well as reviewing the options provided by our current Follett Destiny service. She eliminated Koha due to price (\$15,000 just for the migration fee) and the fact they are an open-source software. Polaris eliminated themselves due to price (they would be higher than \$4,000 annually so declined to provide a quote when hearing our size and that we were considering Apollo and Atriuum). Dawn had personal demos of both Atriuum and Apollo and then they each created a demo system for us so that the staff could try them out. For one week the staff played in both systems and provided their feedback. Both systems are good and both have excellent customer service. However, most of the staff, including Dawn and Shirley, preferred Atriuum. It was easier to navigate, it was more intuitive as a user, and it had a few functions we currently use that Apollo did not have.

There has been much discussion on the library listservs in the past year about ILS systems and Dawn reviewed those conversations. Apollo and Atriuum were the most popular systems. Of the dozens of libraries that switched to Atriuum from another ILS, all of them raved about how great Atriuum is to use and how much friendlier the system is for a public library. There was only one library that said they left Atriuum.

As for the cost, we are somewhat surprised at how affordable Atriuum is based on our estimate a year ago from Apollo. Per their quote, our cost for year 1 will be \$3685. This includes the platform fee (we will be hosted), migration costs from Destiny, and training of staff on the new system. For years 2-5 our platform fee will be \$1230 a year. Specifically the platform fee will cover the following: Circulation system, cataloging system, web-based catalog for the public, patron authentication, offline backup of records, reports module, inventory module, and a mobile version of website.

The Executive Committee was notified of our plan to switch to Atriuum prior to the end of our current year of service with Follett Destiny (March 31, 2020). Atriuum was notified and Shirley signed the required contacts so that the discussion about the migration could begin. Dawn and Shirley have provided Atriuum with all of the information and access to the data they need to implement this process. We have scheduled Tuesday, March 24, 2020 as our date to go live with the new system. Staff training is scheduled for 6 hours (3 for administrative and 3 for general staff) so the library will open at 4 pm on that date to allow all staff to be involved in the training before we start using the system with the public. Dawn has also scheduled a public program on the new system for Monday, April 6 at 6:30 pm.

Notes from the February 25, 2020 meeting of the Fundraising Committee:

The fundraising committee of the James Kennedy Public Library met on Tuesday, February 25, 2020, at 7:00 pm. Present were chairperson Mary Jane Meade and members Catherine O'Hea, Karen Kramer, and Shirley Vonderhaar. Brenda Ingles was excused.

Love My Library Giving Tree: This annual event continues until the end of February. As of the meeting, in \$1449 in cash donations had been received as had some in-kind donations. Shirley noted this seemed lower that past years but that items continue to come in.

Mystery Dinner: Due to a scheduling miscommunication, the Country Club was double-booked so the Mystery Dinner was held on February 8 at the Dyersville Social Center. Proceeds were \$1950 in ticket sales and \$205 in beverage donations for total of \$2155. Expenses were \$660 for Die Laughing and \$780 for food for total of \$1440. We also have the dessert and facebook ads to still be paid so profit is estimated at about \$700. While there was a bit of stress in having to change our location, the end result was we brought in additional revenue (as all the beverages were donated to us), didn't have to pay for the venue as the Social Center is free for city departments, and a couple people said they liked this venue better – better parking and more cozy and they liked that the donation for drinks went to the library. After discussion the Committee agreed to the following:

- 1. Schedule 2021 event for a Saturday evening, February 13, 20, or 27, 2020 with a snow date if possible.
- 2. Hold at the Social Center, reserving all rooms so that we can sell more tickets and use the entry space to greet guests, etc.
- 3. Contact J & D Mart to cater
- 4. Contact Die Laughing to confirm dates they are available and what theme will be for the play (they are planning to have a new production for us.)
- 5. Ask Textile Brewery to donate growlers and O So Good to donate wine (as they did this year), and make available for a suggested donation of \$5.00 per glass
- 6. Allow BYOB for those wanting something more
- 7. Find a couple of volunteers to serve as bartenders
- 8. Have pub mix or pretzels on the tables for snacking during cocktail hour and during the show

We will need to think about pricing as the tables at the Social Center seat 6 instead of 8 so offering a table of 8 for a reduced price won't work. Also, since we didn't have a bar, we gave the first 30 ticket purchasers a coupon for a drink (wine OR beer) rather than putting the bottle on the table. This worked well so will likely be what we do next year, assuming we offer this perk to early ticket purchasers. Shirley will reach out to the City regarding availability of the Social Center, J & D Mart regarding their availability to cater, and Die Laughing regarding the performance to get a date and snow date set.

Build-a-Basket Fundraiser: This event started February 1 with silent auction scheduled to run March 2 - 29. Shirley noted that very few baskets have been claimed so far and none had been donated as of the

meeting date. Committee members said they would talk to a few people and encourage donations. Last year we had over 40 baskets, which was up significantly from previous years.

STEM Night Fundraiser at Country Junction: We are set to have 5 stations (2 FarmTek and 3 Library) plus the Pop-Up Library with free books and info at this event on March 9. Posters, PSA and FB events have been sent out and it will also be in the March events schedule. The committee talked about how to get this information to the schools and Shirley noted that she had discussed this with Dawn, who does all the library publicity, and Dawn had reported that she no longer sends information the schools due to their requirements. Shirley also noted that Kim will sometimes take ½ page fliers to the schools but there are specific guidelines and rules at WD that have to be followed for them to agree to distribute. Shirley will reach out to the schools directly to see what options we have. It was also suggested that we contact the science teachers directly to make sure they are aware of this opportunity.

This event runs from 4 to 7 pm at Country Junction. The library will have 3 STEM stations, plus the popup library so will need a minimum of 4 people working all 3 hours; plus will need people to help with set up and tear down. Depending on participation, additional people are needed. Shirley, Paul, Shannon and Devin from the JKPL are scheduled to work all or part of that time. Committee members should come as soon as they are available to ensure there are enough people to supervise. Catherine said she and her daughter could be there about 4:30 pm. Mary Jane said she should arrive about 6 pm. Karen is not available. Brenda indicated via text that she would be available when needed. Shirley will confirm when Brenda can arrive and put together a schedule.

Wine and Beer Tasting: This annual event is scheduled for Friday, April 17 from 5 to 8 pm. So far O So Good Winery, Textile Brewery and Franklin Street Brewery have agreed to participate. Dimensional Brewery (who participated last year) said they would not be able to participate this year due to other demands. Shirley contacted 7G and they are going to check their schedule to see if they could participate. Shirley contacted Crimson Sunset, Dubuque Heritage Wines, and Farm House Winery and has not heard back from any of them. Dubuque Heritage participated last year and seemed interested in coming back but has not responded. Mary Jane agreed to try to make contact with them as well. Ideally we would have 3 wineries so Shirley will also reach out to Stone Cliff and Tassel Ridge to see if either of them is interested.

Price to attend will remain \$20.00 per ticket in advance and at the door and we have glasses left from last year so don't need to purchase this year. We will ask Lisa Christopher if she is willing to make decorations again. Karen will donate cocktail plates and napkins. Appetizers will be similar to last year – Brenda agreed via text to contact Fareway about donating meat and cheese trays as they did last year. She will also make and donate meatballs. Catherine will donate spinach or similar dip and chips and Karen has a chaffing dish that she thinks will work for serving. Mary Jane will donate pub mix for the tables. Becca at Brew and Brew will make a donate a sweet of some kind.

Jolene said she thought she would be available to sell 50/50 tickets but we will need to check closer to the date to confirm.

The committee agreed to donate tickets to Woman's Night and KDST as part of our marketing this event. Last year, Pat included this event as part of his KDST interview about National Library Week and we are hoping he will do that again.

Plant Sale Fundraiser: The committee decided on May 23, 2020 from 8 to 10 am for this annual event.

Making and selling upcycled greeting cards: Nothing new on this idea.

Pop-Up Fundraisers: As noted at last month's meeting, the committee will consider the possibility of doing pop-up fundraisers at Pizza Hut and / or Subway when the weather is nicer. We are also planning to partner with Dairy Queen for an event there sometime in the summer.

Rounding up Fundraisers: It looks like both Fareway and Randy's do "round up" donations for a cause. The committee thought this would be a good fundraiser to hold during National Library Week. Shirley was to see if Brenda would be willing to talk with Fareway and Randy's about this opportunity.

Donation of percentage of sales: Catherine is going to talk to Pizza Hut and Karen is going to talk to Happy Joes to see what they might be interested in partnering with us to do.

Other projects / activities we would like to consider? The committee talked about the possibility of bagging groceries at Randy's for tips as a fundraiser but felt this would be something maybe the TACKL group would be interested in doing. Shirley will pass this idea on to Paul.

Anything Else?

Set date for next meeting: This committee will meet again on March 24 or 31, 2020 at 7 pm.

UPDATING A STRATEGIC PLAN

As the James Kennedy Public Library completed a full Strategic Planning for Results process in 2015 and the PLA is planning to release a revised process in the next year; it was determined that the library would update the current plan with goals and objectives for 1 to 2 years, instead of using the full process at this time. It was also agreed to include the discussion and development of a Vision Statement as part of this process. This list represents the steps the library will take to complete their updated plan.

- 1. Invite a group of no more than 12 that would include representatives from the Board, city government, Friends of the library and staff to a 4-hour meeting held on one day. This meeting would likely be a Saturday in May or June, meeting from 10 am to 2:00 or 3:00 pm with lunch provided. (Becky is currently available any Saturday except June 6.
- 2. Agenda for that meeting to include: explanation of why everyone is there, outline previous plan model, work of city government, and agreed on method of updating current plan.
- 3. Agenda will also include discussion and recording of: changes to the community, changes in the library, and goals set by city.
- 4. Library staff will then list items accomplished, not completed or in progress from the current plan.
- 5. Using the changes listed from beginning of the meeting, talk about the previously chosen service responses. Let them see the list of all the possible service responses.
- 6. Vote to determine if they want to:
 - a. Keep all service responses the same
 - b. Add any
 - c. Delete any
- 7. Pull the goals and objectives from the old plan that are still appropriate. Fashion new goals (2 or 3 total at the most) for each of the service responses.
- 8. Group will then talk about differences between Vision/Mission/Values/Tag line, review current mission statement and begin process to craft a vision statement.
- 9. At a subsequent meeting, work with staff and/or board to write objectives, using Workform H from SPFR model. Talk about activities and measurements. Set deadline for when they must be finished and handed in to director.
