

 - Library will continue operating with appointment only and curbside services. Walk Ins may be permitted if capacity allows.
- 6. Consider approval of JKPL Interim Service/Reopening Plan (updated)
 - Due to the Covid-19 pandemic and concerns for public and staff health, the JKPL Board has implemented a staged reopening plan, considering state, local, and CDC guidelines. The JKPL is currently in Stage 2 of this plan which included curbside service and being open to the public on an appointment only basis, ensuring a capacity of less than 50%. Updates were discussed to define when the library may move back to Stage 0 or a Stage 1. The JKPL will revert to Stage 0 or Stage 1 services upon learning that a Covid positive person was within the library premises while considered contagious, based on guidance provided by the Dubuque County Health Department. The decision to move to less restrictive stages will be made when it is considered safe to do so, following city, county, local and/or federal (CDC) guidelines. O'Hea MOTIONED to "approve the JKPL Interim Service/Reopening Plan (Updated) incorporating the decision regarding Stage 0 and Stage 1 services and adding in the proposed plan for Stage 3 services." Second by Engelbrecht and CARRIED. Ayes: Meade, Engelbrecht, O'Hea, Kramer, and Will. Nays: None.

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2020 Children's Summer Library Program Final Report

Due to Covid-19, the JKPL restricted access to the library in March and did not offer any in library / in person programs for the summer of 2020. The JKPL purchased READsquared, an online service, to provide a remote way to register and track participation. Patrons were also able to print out and / or pick up paper forms at the library. All programs offered were virtual, online only, Take and Make Kits, passive / outdoor activities or a combination.

Participation in the summer reading programs overall was down tremendously because of the restrictions in services. This was consistent with what we heard from other libraries across the state and country.

Due to the difference in how the program was handled, there is no reason to provide information from past years as the date is not really comparable.

Thirteen virtual / YouTube programs (* below) were purchased by the Friends of the Library and available from June 1-August 15, 2020. The provider was unable to separate out our viewers. They said they had several thousand views per show, but we have no way of knowing how many were JKPL patrons. The estimate of attendance is based on the number of children who signed up to participate in the program this year compared to a typical year, and typical attendance and similar in-person programs in the past.



Notes from the September 3, 2020 Zoom meeting of the Fundraising Committee:

The fundraising committee of the James Kennedy Public Library met via Zoom at 7:00 pm on Thursday, August 6, 2020. Participants were chairperson Mary Jane Meade and members Catherine O'Hea, Karen Kramer, Brenda Ingles, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

Rounding up Fundraisers: Brenda spoke with Bill at Fareway about the Round up idea. Fareway has cut back with the round up programs because things are so tight for everyone. He is happy to donate to us for projects as he has in the past. Brenda explained that we are looking for new ideas for things since many of our projects require gathering — which isn't safe now — and that we would be open to any ideas he might have for ways to raise funds in the current environment. Bill was going to think and discuss with his assistant manager to see what ideas that might have that would work.

Karen reported that Melissa from DQ didn't want to do a Round Up promotion but was willing to have a Library Night and donate a percentage of sales to the JKPL. Due to Covid-19, we won't have any activities or a Pop-Up Library in conjunction with this, but DQ is willing to hand out fliers or other information as part of this event. After discussion, the consensus was to suggest Tuesday, October 6 as a possible date for this event. The library will put together ½ page fliers with one side promoting the virtual services such as TumbleBooks, BrainFuse, etc. and the other side listing the October virtual programs being offered.

Based on the response of these two businesses, the committee decided not to pursue any other Round Up locations at this time.

Expending / Utilization of Funds: At the last meeting, the committee agreed that a good use of funds would be to support school / student needs and virtual services. S Brenda Ingles called to share what she had discovered. First, at the meeting we had talking about using funds to support student educational needs with all of the remote learning, etc. this year. Brenda spoke with James Roberts, the tech person at WD, about their needs. He said they need devices as well as subscriptions to reading, math, etc. electronic services. Shirley emailed Mr. Roberts to discuss further and he requested that we wait until after Labor Day to discuss school needs with him. Shirley also reported on the electronic service Hoopla. Hoopla is described as a groundbreaking digital media service that allows individual to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics and TV shows to enjoy on your computer, tablet, or phone — and even your TV! It is a pay per use model, similar to Kanopy, but offers more items. After discussion the committee agreed that Hoopla appears to duplicate services already offered so we are not recommending this as a service to add at this time.

Chair-ity Event: Publicity for the biannual Chair-ity Fundraiser has begun and participants can pick up chairs at any time. So far, one chair has been picked up. Shirley noted that she will be reaching out to past donors to encourage them to participate again this year. She also commented that the selection of chairs and wooden items currently available at the library is very slim so if anyone has items looking for a new home they would be welcome. Completed items should be brought to the library by October 12, with the silent auction scheduled to run October 12 to November 15. Pictures of each item will be posted on Facebook and the library webpage and people will be able to bid virtually (by calling or emailing the library) or in person by appointment. Voting for the chairs will be October 18 to November 8 with ribbons being on from Nov.9-15. We typically offer a "reception" for the donors on the day we start voting for the ribbon. Due to the pandemic, the committee agreed that a reception should not be planned. Instead we may provide local gift certificates to the donors along with their ribbons. A final

decision on this will be made at our next meeting. The committee will also need to make decisions on the categories for ribbons. That decision is typically made after some of the donations have come in. The silent auction will end at 3:00 pm on Sunday, November 15. This will likely be a hybrid event with people being able to bid virtually as well as in person (by appointment if necessary.) The committee will decide later if it reasonable to hold a reception as part of the ending of this event.

Quilt Raffle: Mary Jo Budan said the Layette group has plenty of quilts and they would be happy to hold a quilt raffle with us again this fall. The schedule for this event will be Monday, November 16 to December 13, with the winner drawn on 14th. Tickets will be the same at: 1 for \$2, 3 for \$5.00 and 10 for \$10.00.

Christmas Cookie Walk: This annual event would normally be on December 5, 2020 from 10 am to 1 pm. A decision whether it is safe and reasonable to hold this event will be made in late October / early November. If we are unable to hold this event as we typically do, the committee brainstormed alternative ideas such as a bake-less bake sale (people donate the funds that they would have spent on ingredients) and purchasing the items in bulk and packaging them for pick up (instead of having donations and people picking out what they want). Other ideas for a way to do this if Covid-19 is still a concern are welcome.

Other projects / activities we would like to consider: The committee discussed the idea of Textile Brewery offering a library themed beer with the JKPL receiving a percentage of sales or something like that. One idea suggested was they could create and offer a special limited run brew that they could promote at the spring Wine and Beer Tasting and then sell after. Another idea was to suggest a "City of Dyersville" brew with the percentage of sales of it each month going to a different Dyersville area organization. The committee also talked about some bigger events like the May the 4th (Star Wars) event that Franklin Street Brewery held last year – potentially featuring libraries and their history in some fashion. No decisions were made.

Set date for next meeting: The next meeting was not officially scheduled but it will likely be held via zoom sometime before the October Board meeting.

Marketing Committee Meeting Minutes: August 27 @ 6:00 pm



This group met over Zoom. Present were Karen Tieskoetter, Danielle Will, and Dawn Schrandt.

1. Introductions

The group made introductions and discussed how we are missing 2 people from our committee. Once one of the board vacancies is filled, that person will be assigned to this committee. Also, Dawn was notified by Kalie Waterman, our community member for this committee, that she is resigning due to family commitments and work.

2. Annual Report

Shirley is preparing to create the FY20 annual report and asked the committee to discuss the format and if we wanted to make any changes to the annual report. After some discussion the committee came to the conclusion that the format is fine. We feel the design makes it easy to read and all the information included is relevant. The only question about content was if we could include something about the endowment that sends people over to the endowment website for more information.

3. Woman's Night

Women's Night has officially been cancelled for 2020. The library is a boothless sponsor so the Chamber said that we will just be listed as a sponsor next year since we have already paid. They are, however, returning the magnets we gave them, which were our item for the goody bags. So next year we'll have to provide them again or choose another item.

4. Meetings

The group talked about how often to meet and what things the marketing committee does or plans for during the year that requires us to meet so we can plan (National Library Week, Woman's Night, special events (ours and in the community), and radio interviews). We agreed to meet semi-regularly when we don't have things to plan (even if it is a short meeting) and to meet as needed when we do have things to plan. The group will meet again in October unless we need to meet sooner. We are hoping to have our other board member on board by the next meeting.
