Strength Training for Older Adults: Mondays and Thursdays, April 1, 4, 8, 11, 15, 18, 22, 25, 29 @ 9:30 and 10:30 am. Older adults of any age and fitness level are invited to join this special exercise program made possible by a partnership between the Geri-Fit® Company and the James Kennedy Public Library. Participants will exercise to a Geri-Fit® DVD and most of the exercises will be performed seated in a chair. There is no dancing or aerobics involved. Classes are held on Mondays and Thursdays and last approximately 45 minutes. For best results, participants should attend as many of the sessions as possible. Each participant will need a set of 2 or 3-pound dumbbell weights, a medium weight stretch band, and water to drink. Due to high demand, two sessions will now be offered, with a maximum of 20 participants allowed per session. Space is limited so registration is required.

This 10-week evidence-based course was developed by doctors to help people aged 55 and older make lifestyle changes to reduce their risk of developing Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia. The KEYS dementia prevention course was started at the YMCA of Greater Des Moines and will be led by local health experts. This series is co-sponsored in part by the Hy-Vee store in Asbury and Nightingale Drug. 

Youth Mental Health First Aid is an early intervention public education program that teaches adults how to recognize the signs and symptoms that suggest a potential mental health challenge, how to listen non judgmentally, how to give reassurance to a youth who may be experiencing a mental health challenge, and how to refer a person to appropriate professional support and services. This course teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people both in crisis and non-crisis situations.

- This will be a blended course with participants completing a 2 hour self-paced online course before attending the in-person instructor-led training on April 27.

March 25, 2024 Notes

Members of the JKPL Fundraising committee met at 6 pm on Monday, March 25, 2024. Participants were Alex Wiezorek, Kami Boffeli, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

Love My Library Giving Tree: The event ran February and March. Total cash donations were \$2,944.00. There were also some in-kind donations of books, puzzles, games, and legos.

Build-a-Basket Fundraiser: Silent Auction ended on Sunday, March 24. We had 38 donated baskets and all had multiple bids on them. Total income is \$1,461.00.

Breakfast Burrito Carry Out Fundraiser: This event is scheduled for Saturday, April 6 as a kickoff event for National Library Week. Fareway is again donating all the ingredients and Brenda is taking lead in making them. Shirley will reach out to Brenda to see if she would like any assistance in making the burritos. Danielle is going to do a Radio Interview about NLW activities and we will donate two certificates for a free burrito to give away on the radio as that is good marketing. Alex is planning to work the sale and Paul will assist with set up of canopy outside, weather permitting.

Music Bingo Fundraiser at O So Good: April 12 will be the National Library Week fundraiser held at O So Good Winery and Distillery. This will be a Music Bingo event lead by Trivial Dudes. There will be opportunities for people to buy an extra card, a free space, 50/50 raffle, bidding on category, etc. with those funds going to the library. Price will again be \$120 for a table of 6 — which will include charcutier board, dessert to share and two bottles of wine or equivalent value in beverages. O So Good will donate a portion of the table sales to the JKPL. The deadline to sell tables is April 8, with a maximum of 10 tables available. The committee discussed that fact that several of the "regular" trivia table purchasers have said they will not be buying tables due to low interest among their friends or conflicts. The committee also discussed possible ways to promote interest but had no new ideas. There was discussion whether this should be changed to just an open event with O So Good donating a portion of sales, or perhaps offering options for a smaller group. Since event has already been planned and marketed, we will continue as is for this year.

Yard Sign Sales: Several years ago, yard signs were purchased as a fundraiser tied to National Library Week. The committee agreed to continue selling these for a donation. Signs will be advertised as available in April and May, but may also be included at the garage sale, plant sale, burrito breakfast, etc.

Spring Plant Sale: The spring plant sale fundraiser has been scheduled for May 4 from 8 to 10 am. Danielle has agreed to be our plant expert for the day. Shirley has requested permission to close half of the parking lot for this event. The plants are all donations from the Board, committee, and community. They are sold for a recommended donation of \$2.00 for small ones and \$4.00 for larger ones. Following the posted hours, plants are available for a donation to the library until gone. Paul will help set up for this event and Shirley is planning to work. Alex will check to see if he is available. Kami cannot work this date.

Garage Sale Fundraiser: This event will be held on Saturday, June 1 from 9 am to 1 pm and is a partnership with the Friends of the JKPL. This date is also the Saturday of the city-wide garage sales and Farm Toy Show Weekend. The JKPL and Friends are asking members of the community to donate good used or new items in resalable condition. We will follow the guidelines from Goodwill regardingwhat will be accepted. Donations should be brought to the library during regular library business hours from

Tuesday, May 27 to Friday, May 31. Items not sold at the sale will be disposed of as the Friends and JKPK Fundraising Committee decide.

The Hoffman Room will be used for staging and has been reserved for this purpose (no programs scheduled for that space from May 28 to June 1). Alex is lead on this event and will be in charge of evaluating and sorting items as they come in. Staff will make sure Alex has access to the Hoffman Room after 5 pm on Friday, March 31 so he can finish prepping everything. Additional volunteers may be needed for sorting and organizing if there is anyone interested.

All items will be priced: \$1.00, \$2.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00 or as marked if there are higher value items donated. We will use dots to color code the items as well as sorting by table / location. One sandwich board will be used to document color coding and pricing. The committee agreed we should have \$100.00 in small bills for making change at this event.

Shirley has requested permission to block off the city parking lot on June 1 and Council will review this request at the April 1 Council meeting. Assuming this is approved, the sale will be held outdoors, weather permitting. Depending on the quantity of items donated for the sale, we will block off all of the lot or leave part of it open for guests to park. Volunteers will also be needed on June 1 to help with final set up (between 8 and 9 am), running the sale, and clean up.

The committee talked about marketing – both how to get donations for this event and how to get customers. Announcement of the event and requests for donations will be included in the April and May program schedules as well as posters in the community. People will be encouraged to save things from their spring cleaning to bring to the library the last week of May. The library may also have a few things to add to the items available. Marketing for sale day will include yard signs to be put up along 136 where the Toy Show traffic flow is. Kami will make and donate 3 signs for this purpose. Shirley will check with the Chamber of Commerce regarding what would be involved in being included in the flier about Toy Show weekend. We will also investigate being included in the Commercial and / or Shopper listing of garage sales for that weekend. The committee would like Danielle to do a radio interview talking about this event in late May and Alex is going to check with KDST about possibly doing a live broadcast from the Library / Parking Lot on June 1.

Sales and Pop-Up Library at DTSN: Downtown Summer Nights are scheduled for Fridays, June 14 and July 12. We typically set up the Pop-up library and also sell freezer pops. We have freezer pops on-hand – probably enough for the June event at least. Price will remain the same. We are looking for two volunteers to work on June 14 as Shirley is likely not available. Kami and Shirley will work July 12.

Sales and Pop-Up Library Downtown Markets: Paul and TACKL typically manage these events. TACKL sells library swag at the Market.

Book Art Fundraiser: Plan is to manage this event as we did last year with the Kickoff at the June 29 Downtown Market donation event at the July 27 Downtown Market. Alex has contacted 7 Hills to see if they would be willing to donate a bowling party again as the prize for this fundraiser. Workers for these two dates will be decided closer to the event.

Next meeting: To be decided.

Facilities Committee Update - April 2024

The Facilities Committee of the JKPL discussed projects and priorities via email. Participants were Ray Kruse, Kami Boffeli, Beth Gudenkauf, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

Capital Projects Plan: After visiting with Mick about the need to replace the blinds in the library, Shirley reported that the JKPL would need to update the capital projects plan to include window treatments and get that approved before he could authorize library capital funds for this project. Mick said anything we want to take out of city / library capital funds should be included in that plan and the blinds were not. The consensus of the group is to draft a revised plan to present to the JKPL Board at their April meeting. The window treatments should be the first priority because of their tattered conditions and the plan needs to be updated to reflect increases is projected costs. The attached proposed Capital Projects plan includes the following:

- Estimated \$10,000 in FY24 (current year) for window treatments based on preliminary quote from Pfohls final cost will depend on products selected
- Estimated \$20,000 per year for replacing the remaining 4 HVAC units that were installed when the building was built in 2000 based on cost for unit purchased in July 2023
- Estimated \$10,000 to replace the 1 furnace only unit that was installed when the building was built in 2000
- Estimated \$2,000 per year for 3 years for painting based on quote from Jay Their
- Estimated \$8,000 per year for 5 years for carpet (total cost estimate of \$40,000 from original plan)
- Estimated \$150,000 to replace room in FY31 when roof will be 30 years old (from original plan)
- Based on this revised plan, for FY26 we should request \$35,000 instead of the \$30,000 we have the last couple of years.

Current project review:

Painting: Eight gallons of paint has been purchased using grant funds. We have estimates from Jay Their for the labor. He is scheduled to do the entry and Hoffman Room May 22 – 24. Cost of this portion will be \$2,025.00 We are going to coordinate and offer library access through the Hoffman Room so hopefully we will not have to close. Labor costs will come out of Capital Funds (if any remaining after window treatments are completed), library maintenance line item, or trust account.

The JKPL has been awarded an additional 6 gallons of paint from Paint Iowa Beautiful. The committee will review the library spaces and funds available and make a decision about whether to utilize this grant to paint another area of the library.

Wallpaper: With painting the Hoffman Room, there is some thought that the wallpaper covering the lower portion of the walls will also need to be replaced. The committee will investigate this need and make a decision on replacing in the next few weeks.

Carpet Cleaning: Premier Carpet Care cleaned the carpet in the Hoffman Room in January and provided a quote to clean all of the library. Since replacing the carpet is a lower priority and may be done in segments, we may elect to clean all or part of the carpet this spring – if funds are available in the library maintenance budget.

Window Treatments: Pfohl's in Dubuque provided the following cost estimate for replacing the window treatments in the JKPL:

- 12-Blackout roller shades with fascia installed \$6838.00 Or 12-Mesh roller shades with fascia installed \$10,438.00. This would replace all of the exterior facing blinds which are the highest priority. Committee or Board needs to decide on final product, color, etc.
- 2-Blackout cellular shades, for doors in conference room, installed \$1346.00. This would replace the tattered shade on the doors between the main library and the Hoffman Meeting Room.
- 1-Cellular shade recorded and new cord lock \$176.00 This is to repair the shade in the Multipurpose / game room.
- Remove and dispose of existing blinds at no charge.

The committee agrees that replacing the blinds in the highest capital priority at this time. This estimate was used to draft the proposed updated capital projects plan.

Hoffman Room / Kitchen Area Work: This project was put on hold until Brian Osterhaus was available to do the work. Shirley will check on his status with the hope we might be able to get this work completed this summer. This project includes replacing the sink with a deeper, larger sink, replacing water faucet, installing dishwasher and doing any resulting cabinet work. This project will be funded from the library trust account using funds donated for the Kids Can Cook program or other funds allocated for Hoffman Room improvements. It will not be funded using city / library capital dollars.

Hoffman Room / Electrical: Terry has ordered some of the needed supplies and is hoping to work on this in April. Plan is to run wiring from the main panel and install a subpanel in the Hoffman Room storage closet. Per original discussion with Mick, this would not be a city / library capital project so cost for this project will be funded from the library maintenance budget or trust account.

Teen Space: Plan was to purchase a high-top table and chairs that is wired for power and devices to be located adjacent to the pillar in teen area. The intent was to provide a work space for teens. Steve Werner memorial money has been authorized for this purpose. Paul and I need to decide on what to order to get this project completed.
