Notes from the April 26, 2021 Zoom meeting of the Fundraising Committee:

The fundraising committee of the James Kennedy Public Library met via Zoom at 6:00 pm on Monday, April 26, 2021. Participants were chairperson Catherine O'Hea and members Mary Jane Meade, Karen Kramer, and Shirley Vonderhaar. Brenda Ingles was excused.

Fareway event: Brenda was not in attendance so couldn't share any new information.

Love My Library Giving Tree: An additional \$250 donation was received, bringing the total cash donations for the 2021 event to \$5,097.78.

Build-a-Basket Fundraiser: Total proceeds from this event were \$1,388.00.

Yard Sign sales: Signs continue to be available for a donation and are to be displayed in April and May.

Plant Sale Fundraiser — This annual event is scheduled for Saturday, May 15 from 8 to 10 am. West side of the city parking lot adjacent to the library is reserved for our use. Karen and Catherine will plan to work this event. Shirley will work if she is in town. Workers will plan to arrive about 7:30 am to get everything set up. Brenda will bring a flatbed truck to sort and display the plants on as well as some plants to sell. We will set up the library canopy to provide shade or rain protection and cover at least one table for a worker to take money / make change. Hand sanitizer will be available. Plants will be sold for \$2.00 or \$5.00 or a donation — depending on the size. Shirley will ask Paul to send out a Facebook message asking for donations of plants of all kinds. The committee wondered if we should have a flier to hand out will all sales promoting the upcoming plant / garden / outdoors related programs scheduled. Shirley will work with Dawn to create something.

Fundraiser / Sales at DownTown Friday Nights: The June event is all day on Saturday June 12, 2021. It is the BBQ Competition and Live Music to be held in Downtown Dyersville in conjunction with Victory Ford. The DTFN portion is from 5:00 to 9:00 pm. After reading the food service guidelines, the committee felt we could offer packaged food like push-ups for sale at this event as we would be operating on city / library property. Since we have been discussing partnering with Fareway, the committee thought to ask if Fareway would be willing to donate or sell the pushups to us at cost. Brenda was asked to check on this. The committee also thought to start with 50 or so (depending on how many come in a package) and will determine the selling price after we learn the cost / value. Decisions on when we will operate, who will work, price, etc. will be decided in May when we know costs, etc. Decisions on participating in the July event (July 9) will be made after the June event.

Fundraiser / Sales at Downtown Market: 6/25/21, 7/21/21, 8/28/21, 9/25/21 — While we think this is a great opportunity, the committee is concerned about the food license requirements and finding people to staff a booth on Saturday

mornings. The committee will discuss again and make a final decision at their next meeting.

Outdoor / STEAM event partnerships: In the past, the Fundraising Committee has partnered with local businesses to host a Family STEAM activity with a fundraising component. No action has happened for scheduling these in 2021. Karen will check with Melissa at DQ and Brenda will check with Subway to see about partnering with them and holding the activities in the grass lot adjacent to their building.

Wine and Beer Tasting: The Committee is looking to schedule this event for the fall and both dates suggested - September 24 or October 1 would be fine with Becca (Brew & Brew). Because the Woman's Night event has been scheduled for the last week of September, the committee feels we should tentatively plan for Friday, September 24. Shirley reported that Tricia, the city clerk, thought that outside access would be a possibility. She thought Brew & Brew would have to request and get a license for outside service and there might be a small fee for that. If we want to pursue this idea, we would need to decide what area we want to block off and request permission from the city. We may also need some kind of temporary barrier to designate the allowed space. Karen talked to Baseball Museum about partnership / being open and they were willing however it doesn't sound like they would allow beverages in the building.

The committee also discussed whether we should consider going back to holding this event in the library as it would allow more space for social distancing. Given the current environment, the committee wondered about hosting the event at the library without charging a set fee and just having a container for donations. Shirley will check on regulations to see if there has been any changes and the committee will discuss again. There is time to decide but the sooner we do, the sooner we can reach out to vendors.

Library or Dyersville brew: Brenda offered to talk to the owners at Vibe and Shirley planned to talk to the owner of NuYOU to see about this as a fundraising activity for the library. No new information at this time. Discussion of a brew with Textile Brewery will be revisited as part of the planning for the Wine and Beer Tasting event.

Mystery Dinner: Scheduled for Saturday, February 12 as main event, and snow date of Saturday, February 19 with Social Center, Die Laughing and J & D Catering. No action needed at this time.

Pie Tasting / Sales: Committee will consider this in the future.

Selling apparel: Committee thinks this would be best as a fall project so will discuss again later.

Food Truck: Catherine reported that Happy Hibachi would be interested in bringing a Food Truck to Dyersville as a fundraiser. The library would get a percentage of sales. After discussion, Karen agreed to contact Commercial Club Park to see if they would be willing to host this event. We are looking at Monday, June 14, from 11:00 am to 2:00

pm. Since this is the start of the children and teen summer reading program we will promote as a "Kick off" event. We will have the pop-up library, life size games, and possibly other activities at the park.

Other projects / activities we would like to consider: Nothing new to share.

Anything Else? Nothing new to share.

Set date for next meeting: Next meeting will be held in late May so that potential June events can be included in the June events schedule.
