





#### **Niche Academy Tutorials!**

You already know that the James Kennedy Public Library is so much more than books and that we also have a great offering of digital services such as Ancestry Library Edition, eBooks through Overdrive and FREADING, and homework help and job search help from Brainfuse (just to name a few). Now we have partnered with Niche Academy to make it easier for you to learn how to use our digital services!



Niche Academy creates online tutorial experiences and there are currently 20 tutorials available, one for all of our digital services except one. There are also tutorials for how to use social media or Google programs, or Goodreads. Each tutorial is short and sweet, typically no more than 2 minutes. But it will give you a basic understanding of how to use the program in question, which will hopefully make it easier for you to use the service.

Click on it to open up Niche Academy and view all the tutorials available to you. Another way to access the Niche Academy tutorials is by going to the page on our website for the service you are interested in (services can be found on the Online Reference or Digital Collection pages). Below each service is a link to its tutorial. So you can, for example, watch the tutorial for

## Notes from the November 3, 2021 meeting of the Fundraising Committee:

The fundraising committee of the James Kennedy Public Library met in person at 6:00 pm on Wednesday, November 3, 2021. Participants were chairperson Catherine O'Hea and members Karen Kramer, Marcus Ingles and Shirley Vonderhaar. Brenda Ingles was excused.

**Wreath-it Up:** Twenty-four items have been received. The silent auction runs until November 14 and most items have at least one bid. Catherine will take the lead on closing this event and calling the winners. Marcus thought he might be available as well. Dawn will be the staff member assisting.

**Layette Ladies' Quilt Sale:** The Layette Ladies' Quilt Sale will run from November 15 to December 23. Quilts will be mostly layette size, but this year there will also be some larger ones. Because of the varied sizes, each quilt will have a price on it, ranging from \$25.00 and up. The library will receive \$10.00 for each quilt sold, with the remainder going to the Layette group.

Breakfast Burrito Grab and Go Fundraiser: This new event is planned for Saturday, November 27 in conjunction with Shop Small / Shop Local Saturday from 7 to 10 am. Price is \$4.00 for a burrito and \$5.00 for a meal (includes small milk or juice and pumpkin cookie.) Marcus is leading this project. He reported that he is asking the area grocery stores to donate ingredients, and what isn't donated by them will be donated by other members of the fundraising committee. Catherine will check with Midwest One about donating napkins, cups and / or lids. We are planning to prepare and serve 40 burritos and they will be available until 10 am or until sold out. Since this is a new event, publicity will be our normal posters, social media, etc. We will also put out the sandwich board and Marcus and Paul will do a Facebook Live video during set up. Karen is also working the event. Paul from the library staff is also expected to help with setup and management.

**Selling apparel:** The final t-shirt design was decided via email and the first order has arrived. The front of the shirt is "Read, Return, Repeat" and the back in the library logo. Both designs are printed in black and this first order was printed on maize (yellow) bella unisex shirts. Cost for shirts is \$8 each for sizes small, medium, large and extra large; 2 x is \$11 and 3x is \$12. The committee decided to charge \$15 for each shirt, regardless of size. Marcus ordered 3 of each size and that order is now in Shirley's office. Priority for shirts is those working the upcoming events as that is a good way to market, Board members, and library staff. Consensus was to start with keeping a couple on hand at the library to sell and then also put together an order form with the library placing orders weekly as demand warrants. Additional colors and styles will be included on the order form.

**Christmas Cookie Walk:** The committee would like to hold the Cookie Walk but has some concerns due to the pandemic. The consensus was to start calling cookie donors and see what their response is to donating. To reduce potential crowding, the committee decided to hold the Cookie Walk on three days – Friday, December 3 to

Sunday, December 5. The committee also talked about putting only samples of the cookies out for the purchaser to select from and having all the cookies stored away from the public. Purchasers will identify the cookies wanted and then workers will fill the plate, bag, etc. The committee will work out the details in the next week or so via email.

**Soup Lunch and Dinner Fundraiser:** Scheduled for Monday, January 10 for both lunch and dinner. Board members are asked to donate at least one ice cream tub (4 to 5 quart) of either chili or chicken noodle soup. Committee will discuss more details at an upcoming meeting.

**Love My Library Giving Tree:** Will start Monday, January 10 and run until the end of February. Library staff will be putting together wish lists in the next few weeks and Shirley will again send out letters to all area Chamber members and past donors.

**Build-a-Basket Fundraiser:** This annual event will run from February 1 to April 10. Donors will be able to sign up / pick up baskets in February with the silent auction to run during March and April.

**Mystery Dinner:** This event is scheduled for Saturday, March 5 at the Social Center. The committee will make decisions regarding audience size, menu, cost, etc. at a future meeting.

**Wine and Beer Tasting:** This annual event normally takes place during National Library Week – which is April 3-9, 2022. It was not held in 2020 or 2021 due to Covid. The committee will discuss again at a future meeting, noting the sooner decisions are made the better it is for potential vendors.

Other projects / activities we would like to consider: Nothing new.

Anything Else? Nothing new.

**Set date for next meeting:** The committee will meet via email to finalize plans for the Cookie Walk and will set the next meeting date via email.

#### Notes from JKPL Furnishings, Art & Facilities Committee email discussion

Participants: Ray Kruse, Alex Wiezorek, Sue Engelbrecht, Betty Anne Scherrman, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

The JKPL Furnishings, Art and Facilities committee did not meet in person this month but discussed issues via email. The primary focus was communication with city administrator Mick Michel to clarify the process for funding larger repair and capital projects. The committee had hoped to meet in person with Mick, but could not get a meeting scheduled. Instead, Ray Kruse, committee chair, reported the following from his telephone conversation with Mick:

- Mick does not feel a meeting is necessary but he will meet with committee if they wish.
- Mick prefers to receive communication through the Board President or Library Director.
- The library should include in their annual budget all planned updates such as for HVAC, carpet, roof, etc.
- Misc. repairs, even those like the exterior door, should be handled as they arise by the library
  and paid for out of the library operating budget. If the expense is more than library
  maintenance budget line item can handle, the library can request a budget amendment to
  address. The city has emergency repair funds set aside (but it was unclear when or if these
  funds would be allocated to library needs.)
- He is looking at the exterior brick wall issue and handling this out of city funds.

Based on this conversation, the facility committee agreed that Shirley should call the contractor recommended by Public Works employee Terry Recker and proceed with repairing or replacing the door and frame that is rusty and leaks. If it is a significant expense, that quote will be reviewed with the Public Works Department (John Wandsnider) and / or Mick.

The facility committee recommends that the Finance Committee include in the FY22 budget amendment a request for the \$28,000 from FY21 that was allocated for HVAC and not utilized in FY21

The committee also will begin thinking about FY23 projects and costs so they be included as capital project requests in the FY23 budget process.

#### Notes from Finance Committee Electronic Discussion – October 2021

Participants: Angela English, Catherine O'Hea, Ray Kruse, Mary Radloff, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

The finance committee discussed the FY22 budget and the need to request a budget amendment to address the library personnel budget shortfall.

#### Operating budget:

According to the most current city report, the JKPL underspent the library budget by \$16,049.11. (This amount changed by \$5,759.00 as there was a deduction documented in June for Group Insurance.) The JKPL brought in \$1,144.59 less revenue than we had anticipated. Based on these adjustments, JKPL left a total of \$14,904.52 unspent in FY21. The consensus of the committee is to request an operating budget amendment of \$14,905 to be used for the following purposes:

Per discussion with the city during FY22 budgeting (Jan 21), the JKPL FY22 budget is under the amount needed to maintain services by \$5,179. This amount was cut from the requested library appropriation personnel area as part of the FY22 budgeting process, with the understanding that it would be appropriated during FY22 if the library underspent the FY221 budget by that amount. Recommendation: The FY22 Operating Budget Amendment request should include \$5,179 to be appropriated for FY22 Personnel Expenses.

During budget planning for FY22, the JKPL Board estimated a 1.5% COLA increase based on information provided by the city. The actual approved COLA increase for city employees for FY 22 was 2%. An additional \$951 in wages and \$171 in benefits (IPERS, Medicare, etc.) is needed in the JKPL personnel budget to account for this adjustment. The FY22 Operating Budget Amendment request should include \$1,122 to be appropriated for FY22 Personnel Expenses.

The JKPL compensation plan (approved in 2014) needs to be revised based on the current employment environment and the results of the Classification and Compensation Study received by the City of Dyersville in June 2021. The personnel committee has not yet met to review and discuss a plan to implement the compensation study as they are waiting to see what process the city implements first. However, current starting pay for library clerks is \$8.77 per hour. This is NOT competitive when many places are now offering a starting rate of \$12 to \$15 per hour. The finance committee is therefore recommending that any remaining funds be used to implement pay adjustments for library staff. The FY22 Operating Budget Amendment request should include \$8,604 to be appropriated for FY22 Personnel Expenses.

#### Capital Projects:

For FY21, the JKPL budgeted \$28,000 to replace two HVAC units (\$14,000 each). This project was not completed in FY21 and those funds were not used. *The FY22 Capital Budget Amendment request should include \$28,000 to be appropriated for FY22.*

#### Marketing Committee Meeting Minutes: Email discussion held the week of October 11, 2021

Included: Karen Tieskoetter, Alex Wiezorek, Danielle Will, Dawn Schrandt

#### 1. New TV

The TV that hangs near the front doors that we use for a slideshow of upcoming programs is going bad. The group discussed replacing it. According to Shirley the cost can come out of either the Trust account or Maintenance line item and the committee felt this could be considered a Maintenance item. The general estimate of cost to replace is \$338-\$500 (based on Best Buy and Amazon websites) for a 50" size wall mounted, flat screen. Cost does not include wall mounting or if new hardware to mount is necessary. Committee agreed that a cheaper TV should suffice since it is just to run a slideshow of programs. Tech Mates in Dyersville also sells TVs and Dawn contacted them three times to request a quote and they never provided the information. While the committee would prefer to shop local, all encouraged Dawn to move forward researching and possibly purchasing a TV from Best Buy since Tech Mates doesn't seem interested.

#### Update from October 27, 2021:

Tech Mates in Dyersville never provided the requested quote for the new TV. Dawn contacted the new business in town, SurgIT, that does computer/television repairs and installations. They provided a quote of \$350 for a 50" smart tv, \$50 installation fee, and \$25 recycling fee for the old tv. We do not need a smart tv for our purposes, however SurgIT confirmed that it is very hard to find a non-smart tv these days. They were able to find one option that was 7" smaller than the size we currently have. The cost difference was \$100 so the committee opted to stick with the 50" tv. The committee agreed the cost can come out of the Maintenance line item. Dawn placed the order for the TV on October 27.

### 2. While You Wait program

Carnegie-Stout Library has a partnership program called *While You Wait* where they partner with 10 different businesses/healthcare facilities in Dubuque to provide books for their waiting rooms.

- o Books are all donated items the library didn't want or withdrawn items from the library's collection
- o Each business partner gets a new batch of books (15-20) one time per month.
- o Books are for all ages.
- o Books are labeled and are free for customers to take with them from the waiting room.
- o Program is volunteer run at 8 hours per month or less (volunteer that contacts businesses, coordinates delivery of books, labels books, etc.)

The committee thought this sounded like a good idea. It was suggested that a minimum of 5 businesses be signed up in order to start the program and make it worth the time to run. Karen volunteered her spa and her AirBnB as two of the businesses that would put books out. We will need to find a volunteer to run the program. The committee will move forward with this this season.

#### Notes from November 4, 2021 Policy Committee Meeting

The Policy Committee of the James Kennedy Public Library met via Zoom on Thursday, November 4, 2021 at 5 pm. Present were chairperson Sue Engelbrecht and members Angela English, Danielle Will, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

The topic of discussion was potential revisions to the Pandemic Interim Service Plan. There was extensive discussion and varying opinions on best practice. The recent surge in Covid-19 cases in Dubuque County with 434 new cases in 7 days was noted. This equates to 62 cases per day and is the highest it has been since January 2021 — when the library was only offering curbside services. Balancing that perspective of potentially implementing greater restrictions (based on those numbers) is the local community climate of businesses, schools and gatherings being open with no masking or other restrictions in place. The committee also polled library staff and volunteers regarding their preference regarding the staff requirement for masking.

The following are the recommendations of the committee:

Library Program capacity limit: The committee recommends no change in the current policy on capacity (restricted to 20 at an indoor library sponsored gathering).

Providing food / refreshment at programs: The committee recommends that refreshments may be allowed at library sponsored events and provided by the library if staff planning the event believe it is an important part of the activity. Recommendation is to provide closed containers, sealed and / or prepackaged items, or staff to hand out individual items rather than having a plate of cookies for people to pick from (for example).

Staff mask requirement: The committee recommends no change in the current policy (masks are required at all times in public or shared spaces unless are outdoors and socially distanced).

The committee also noted that a review of the plan as a whole and what the guidelines are for some of the policies to change may be in order. Future meetings will address this question.
