### November 25, 2024 Fundraising and Marketing Committee Meeting Notes

Members of the JKPL Fundraising and Marketing Committee met at 6:00 pm on Monday, November 25, 2024. Participants were Alex Wiezorek, Monika Steffen, Beth Gudenkauf, and Shirley Vonderhaar. Danelle Schroeder was excused.

**Chair-ity Fundraiser:** The Chair-ity Fundraiser ended on November 24. We only received 4 items this year and bidding was minimal. The total raised was \$110.00. 2025 is Wreath event so will discuss in 2026 the future of the Chair-ity Fundraiser. If we choose to continue with the Chair-ity event, it was suggested that we reach out to the high school art teachers.

**Layette Quilt Display and Sale:** The quilts went on display on November 25 and will be up until December 23.

Breakfast Burrito Grab and Go Fundraiser: This event is scheduled for November 30 from 9:00 to 11:00 am, ending early if sold out. Price will be \$6.00 each and burritos will be made onsite. Fareway has agreed to partner with the JKPL again and donate all of the ingredients and supplies needed. They will be delivered to the library on Wednesday. Alex is lead on this event and will bring his Blackstone and all needed utensils for cooking. Catherine and Danelle have volunteered to work as well. Work time for this event is estimated to be 8 am to 12:00 noon. Shirley will be out of town this weekend but Paul will be available to help with set up. Blackstone will be set up outside. Due to the forecast, sales will be held in the Hoffman Room. This in intended as a grab and go event but we will set up a few tables for guests wanting to eat on site. Napkins, cups, and water will be available for those eating in the Hoffman Room. Shirley has kept \$150, mostly dollar bills, from library deposits in order to have enough to make change. Sales will be first come, first served but if someone calls ahead, those working will try to accommodate those requests. Marketing for this event will include the typical activities as well as putting out the sandwich board. Beth did a radio interview at KDST and KDST is giving away coupons for free burritos this week.

**Cookie Walk Fundraiser:** This annual event is scheduled for December 6-8. Hours and workers are as follows: Friday: 1 to 5 pm - Beth D and Sally, Saturday: 9 am to 4 pm - Catherine and Shirley (morning), Shirley and her daughter (afternoon) and Sunday: 1 to 4 pm - Alycia and Melissa. Price will stay at \$8.00 dozen or \$15 for 2 dozen. Plated (no discount) and individual cookies (\$1) as well as hot chocolate (\$1) will also be taken and sold at the vendor market, which is Saturday, December 7 from 12 to 4 pm. Alex and Danelle will work at the market. The JKPL will also take the pop-up library to the vendor market and have a presence in the lighted parade as well.

Staff and volunteers have contacted past donors for this event. Approximately 115 people have agreed to donate so we should have enough cookies to meet needs. Shirley purchased more plates and basket bags. Jolene and her students made bows with all the ribbon we had on hand so we should have plenty for this year. Jolene said they would be happy to do more next year as well.

Shirley purchased 176 - 12 oz insulated cups and lids. We are planning to make two large insulated coolers full of cocoa and will sell until gone. Alex will pick up plated cookies, individual cookies, coolers with hot cocoa, cups, and the sandwich board to take to the event. He will also need cash to make change and gloves for handling the individual cookies.

Shirley mentioned that we have a lot of plastic decorative plates and some cookie boxes that have been donated over the years. The committee agreed that these should be offered for \$1.00 each to anyone who might want to put their cookies on something other than the paper plates.

**Soup Lunch and Supper:** This event is scheduled for Monday, January 13, 2025. Lunch will run from 11:30am – 1:00 pm & dinner from 4:30 – 6:30 pm. Pricing will again be \$5.00 per bowl, \$7.00 for meal – includes crackers, bun, and cookie, and \$10.00 for quart. Lunch volunteers are Beth G, Beth D, Catherine (maybe), and Angela E. Dinner volunteers are Danelle, Alycia, Melissa, and Monika. Everyone on the board has indicated what soup they will donate. Based on last year, we will need enough soup for at least 200 servings so will need 10 to 12 gallons of each flavor. If possible, we would like to have more as we sold out last year. The committee agreed we would ask Board members if they would be willing to donate more than one gallon. Shirley will also contact past donors to see if they are willing to contribute this year.

While this is intended as a carry out event, some people did opt to eat at the library last year and appreciated this option. A couple tables and chairs will be set up and we will have cups and pitchers of water available.

Shirley checked supplies on hand. We have 150 - 16 oz bowls with lids, 50 quarts with lids, and 20 12 oz bowls with lids. We have 170 clamshell containers and approximately 110 breakfast trays. We have 139 sets of utensils. The committee decided we would not get any additional supplies this year as what we have should be sufficient.

Other items needed are buns and crackers. Last year Dollar Fresh donated the buns and the crackers were purchased as no one locally has individual packets. Beth will contact Dollar Fresh about donating this year.

Beth agreed to do another KDST interview to promote this, Love My Library, Puzzle event, and other January library activities in early January. Dawn will schedule the interview. We will also ask KDST to give away coupons for 2 free meals.

Love My Library: This event typically runs in January and February. Past practice — letters were sent to chamber members with request and suggested items. After discussion the committee agreed to continue with the same basic format, just expand it to being a bulk mailing that goes out to a larger audience, and discuss a regular appeal letter at a later date. They discussed sending to all 52040 zip code addresses, which would be about 3000 households, but did not make a decision. The committee reviewed the current letter and asked Shirley to revise based on it going out as a general mailing, not just to businesses and organizations. Shirley will also have library staff start working on wish lists so they are ready in early January. They would like the letter to include a QR code to take readers to the full wish list and library staff will be asked to keep the online list as up to date as possible. The committee thought a slight revision to the By the Numbers information (discussed later) would be a good insert. They also asked Shirley to investigate how the library could accept donations via Venmo as the Fire Department is doing. Additional details for Love My Library will be addressed at next committee meeting.

**Puzzle Fundraiser:** This new event was scheduled for January 29, National Puzzle Day, from 6 to 8 pm at Textile Brewery. The committee learned that Textile will be closed on the 29<sup>th</sup> so we need to adjust the date. Textile also had some suggestions so the committee made some changes to the event. This event

will now be held on February 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup>, whichever date Textile thinks will have the best participation. After discussion, the committee decided to take out the food component of the competition and reduced the price to participate to \$40 per team of up to 4 people. The JKPL will receive a percentage of food sales during the event. Teams will receive a puzzle only and compete to be the first to complete. Maximum number of teams is 12. Prizes will likely be gift certificates to Textile Brewery. Beth will contact Textile to confirm the date and ask if they will donate prizes. Alex will MC and will plan some twists to raise additional money for the JKPL. He will probably need some assistants to help. Participants are welcome to bring sorting boards. At our next meeting, the committee with work on the details of the twists.

**2025 Mystery Dinner:** This event is scheduled for Saturday, February 22 with a snow date of March 1. Confirmed with Social Center, Brew Ha Ha and J & D Catering. The committee decided on Fast Times at James Kennedy High for the performance (80s Trivia / School Reunion theme). Last year price was \$75 per seat or \$400 for table of six and the committee agreed this was still acceptable. The committee reviewed options from J & D Mart Catering and decided on a menu of Sliced roast pork loin, Salisbury steak, mashed potatoes, glazed carrots, and Italian pasta salad. With the 80s theme they thought it would be fun if we could have Oreo and strawberry fluff for the dessert so Shirley will check with J & D to see about that addition. The JKPL will start marketing the event in December so we can offer tickets potentially as holiday gifts.


#### Marketing:





### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE JAMES KENNEDY PUBLIC LIBRARY, DYERSVILLE, IOWA

### Article I (Name)

The name of this organization shall be the James Kennedy Public Library – Dyersville, Iowa.

### Article II (Purpose)

The object of this organization shall be to promote and improve library service to residents of Dyersville, and to all towns and county organizations who have contracts with the James Kennedy Public Library -- Dyersville, Iowa.

### Article III (Members)

This free public library of the city shall be under the control and direction of the Library Board of Trustees. The board shall consist of nine members who shall be appointed by the Mayor and with the approval of the Council. At least one and no more than two members may be nonresidents. As the terms of office of the board expire, the Mayor, with the approval of the Council shall appoint their successors, each of whom shall hold office until his successor is appointed and qualifies.

The term of office of any member shall commence on the first day of July of the year in which they are appointed. A term of office shall be for four (4) years. Vacancies occurring on the board through death, resignation, or permanent removal from the City or a contracting area shall be filled by the Mayor, with the approval of the Council, but such appointment shall be only for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Citizens and residents of the City of Dyersville, over the age of eighteen are alone eligible to membership on the board as resident trustees. The nonresident members of the board shall be citizens and residents over the age of eighteen from the areas which contract with the James Kennedy Public Library for Library Service. Members of the board shall receive no compensation for their services. In the event an area ceases to contract with the City, a nonresident trustee from that area shall cease as trustee at the same time the area's contract expires or terminates, and such vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as a resignation if any portion of such trustee's term remains.

### Article IV (Officers)

Officers shall consist of a President, Vice-President, and Secretary. The President shall preside at all meetings, appoint committees, execute all documents authorized by the Board, and generally perform all duties associated with the office. In the absence or disability of the President, or of a vacancy in the Presidency, the Vice President shall assume and perform the duties of the President. The Secretary will record a true and accurate account of the proceedings of the Board of Trustees. In the absence or disability of the President and the Vice President, the Secretary shall assume the duties of the President. The President and Secretary shall sign all disbursement lists prepared by the Director.

Election of officers shall be during a special meeting to be held immediately prior to the first regular Board meeting of the fiscal year. The sole purpose of this special meeting is election of officers. The

new officers will assume their duties immediately thereafter. No elective officer shall hold the same office for more than three consecutive years. In the event of the death or resignation of any officer, the Board shall choose a successor at the first meeting following the vacancy and that person shall hold office until the next regular election of officers.

### Article V (Committees)

The following are the standing committees of the Board. The Board President appoints members. Terms end in July.

#### Personnel Committee:

The Personnel Committee will serve in an advisory role for the Board and be a resource for the director and staff regarding personnel issues. Functions of this committee include but are not limited to:

- Drafting and / or revising personnel policies for Board approval
- Reviewing job descriptions
- Reviewing wage and salary structure
- Responding to formal written staff grievances against the library director or when an employee appeals a decision by the library director
- Performing other duties related to personnel issues as requested by the President of the Library Board of Trustees or by the Board as a whole

### Furnishings, Art and Facility Committee:

The Furnishings, Art and Facility Committee will serve in an advisory role for the Board and be a resource for the director when recommending and reviewing issues regarding the library facility and the needs for furnishings, decorating, equipment, and technology in the library. Functions of this committee include but are not limited to:

- Reviewing and recommending solutions to facility related issues to the Library Board
- Reviewing and recommending changes in furnishings and equipment to the Library
- Making decisions regarding the acceptance of donated furnishings, equipment, art, and decorative items
- Approving the use of the Hoffman Display unit for other temporary displays
- Performing other duties related to library facilities and furnishing as requested by the President of the Library Board of Trustees or by the Board as a whole.

### **Policy Committee:**

The Policy Committee will serve in an advisory role for the Board and be a resource for the director when recommending, reviewing and / or revising library policies. Functions of this committee include but are not limited to:

- Reviewing and recommending changes in existing policies to the Library Board
- Working with the director and / or designated staff in researching and creating new policies needed by the library
- Performing other duties related to the creation, review, approval, or explanation of
  policies as requested by the President of the Library Board of Trustees or by the Board as
  a whole.

#### Finance Committee:

The Finance Committee will serve in an advisory role for the Board and be a resource for the director when reviewing library finances. Functions of this committee include but are not limited to:

- Reviewing financial documents
- Working with the director and / or designated staff to create a proposed annual budget
- Performing other duties related to finance as requested by the President of the Library Board of Trustees or by the Board as a whole.

### Fundraising, Marketing and Public Relations Committee:

The Fundraising, Marketing, and Public Relations Committee will serve in an advisory role for the Board and be a resource for the director when selecting, planning, and implementing fundraising activities to support the work of the library as well as marketing and publicizing the library services. Functions of this committee include but are not limited to:

- Working with the library director and / or designated staff to research, select, plan and implement fundraising activities
- Working with the library director and / or designated staff to identify library needs and / or services that might be enhanced by utilizing outside funding sources and fundraising
- Working with the library director and / or designated staff to implement marketing and public relations strategies, including special programs and activities
- Reviewing marketing and promotional policies and plans
- Performing other duties related to fundraising, marketing, and public relations as requested by the President of the Library Board of Trustees or by the Board as a whole.

### Article VI (Meetings)

The library board shall meet at the James Kennedy Public Library on the second Tuesday of each month. Meetings may be scheduled on alternate dates if needed. Special meetings may be called at the option of the officers. It is the responsibility of the President to set the date of the meeting, and of the Secretary to notify the members. Any member missing four consecutive meetings without just excuse may be removed from the library board. Five members constitute a quorum. The Library director or representative shall be in attendance at all open meetings of the Board.

### Article VII (Powers)

The Board of Trustees will comply with the Iowa Code in all questions of library law and governance and will further comply with the regulations set forth in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Dyersville, Iowa. Chapter 22 of the Code of Ordinance addresses the responsibilities of the Library Board of Trustees. Further, The Library Board of Trustees shall have exclusive control of the expenditure of all portions of the municipal funds allocated for library purposes by the council, and of the expenditure of all moneys available by gift or otherwise for the erection of library buildings, and of all other money belonging to the library fund, including gifts, donations, funds raised on behalf of the library through special activities, and grants.

### Article VIII (Yearly Reports)

The board of trustees shall each year make to the council a report of the year ending June 30<sup>th</sup> giving a statement of the condition of the library, the number of books added thereof, the number circulated, and the amount of money expended in the maintenance thereof during such fiscal year, together with such further information as may be deemed important.

### Article IX (Amendments)

These by-laws may be revised or amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote, providing the proposed amendments are received by each library board member thirty days prior to the meeting.

### Article X (Order of Business)
