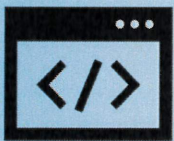

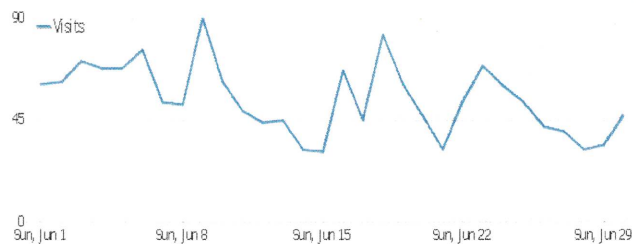

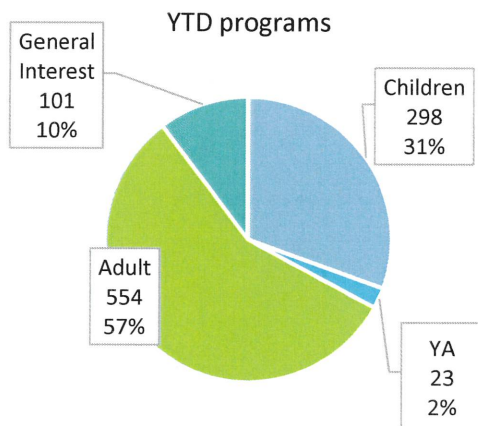

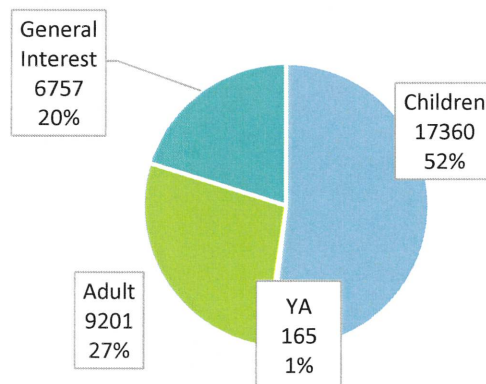
Monthly attendance
