#### Adult Summer Library Program: June 1—August 31

Everyone 18 and older is encouraged to participate in the 2025 program that runs June 1—August 31. This year's theme is *Color Our World*. The program theme this year invites you to embark on a journey of art and creativity, while celebrating the myriad ways in which art enriches our lives. - Participating in the Adult Summer Library Program? Up to eight of the books you read for bingos may also be included for that program as well.

#### Color Our World: Favorite Color: June 1-30

# CONNECT TO THE JKPL CATALOG ONLINE WITH LIBRISTA!

Download the Librista app to your mobile device and connect directly to a mobile friendly version of our catalog and access it from anywhere! It connects to the same catalog you can access via the library's website, only Librista skips the step of having to go through our website to get to the catalog.

Librista is easy to use and free. Download it from your app store (both Apple and Android) and set the JKPL as your library. It will then connect to our catalog.

The coolest feature of the Librista app is that to search for something in the catalog you can either type it in or use your camera to scan an ISBN to search the catalog to find out if the library owns a copy. Please note, that by using the ISBN search, only items with that exact ISBN will show. If the library owns copies of the item in other formats (i.e. audiobooks or large print), those copies will not show.

## Upcoming Events for JULY 2025 and Beyond

#### Notes from Friends Meeting – May 2025

Over the last few months, there have been changes in who is serving on the Friends Board (resignations and new members) as well as new officers. There are current 8 Board members (typically have 10 and Bylaws allow up to 12) so the group may be looking for new members. Current officers are President – Vicki Mescher, Vice-President – Nancy Breitbach, Treasurer – Bonnie Steffensmeier, and Treasurer – Mari Vorwald.

Friends membership for 2025 brought in total income of \$9,320 – including membership dues and donations.

The 2025 Bus Trip fundraiser to Heartbreak Hotel in May was sold out. It brought in \$2,236.10 profit.

As of May 2025, the Friends have \$26,234.97 in their checking account and a CD value of \$18,228.30.

The Friends agreed that these funds could be allocated for the visit by children's author Scott Reisfer in July.

The Friends discussed the JKPL request for funds to supplement the JKPL materials budget. No action was taken. The Friends approved the request for up to \$1,092 to sponsor an acrylic painting class. This will fund 3 classes / opportunities to make an 8 x 10 inch painting. Final cost for the event will depend on registration. The Friends approved funding for visits from author Jeff Bremer (\$100) and Micihelle Sprout (\$150).

The July 2025 Book Sale is scheduled for July 18-21.

Good morning everyone,

Shirley and I have discussed the FY26 library operating budget and the email below. I wanted to clarify the matters raised in your message.

First, I would like to confirm the figures mentioned. The library board requested an expense amount of \$576,785. However, the city's budget, submitted to the Council on February 20, 2025, allocated \$558,785 for library expenses. Both the city's budget worksheet and the library board's proposal were attached for the Council's consideration. The final budget, submitted on March 21, 2025, maintained the library expense at \$558,785. I can verify that \$558,785 was correctly reflected in the State Form (Expenditures Schedule Page 1, Line 31). The \$540,000 was a FY 25 expense listed on the State Form (Re-Estimated Expenditures Schedule Page 1, Line 31). Therefore, the library board only has the authority to spend on or less than \$558,785 starting on July 1, 2025, and ending on June 30, 2026.

Since the FY26 budget has been approved and finalized, the library board's only option to seek additional funding would be to request a budget amendment from the city. This process can only begin on or after July 1, 2025.

Looking ahead, Shirley and I have agreed to establish a more collaborative approach for future budgets. We plan to meet to discuss both the City's proposed worksheet and the library board's budget proposal before any budget work session with the City Council. This should help ensure that all parties are aligned and that any concerns can be addressed early in the process.

Notes from Fundraising Committee – May 13, 2025

Members of the JKPL Fundraising and Marketing Committee met on Tuesday, May 13, 2025 before and after the regular Board Meeting. Attendees were Alex Wiezorek, Monika Steffen, Danelle Schroeder, Beth Gudenkauf and Shirley Vonderhaar.

The Committee made the following decisions regarding the Puzzle Fundraiser

- Event will be held on Wednesday, June 25, 2025
- Cost will be \$80.00 for team of up to 4 individuals
- Tickets must be purchased in advance, will be a maximum of 20 tables
- Each team will receive a puzzle, 4 drink tickets and 1 coupon for an appetizer to share (must be consumed at this event)
- Doors will open for check in at 5 pm, getting drinks and appetizer
- Puzzle contest will start at 6 pm
- Each team will receive 2 changes to win a Twist to start out the event; Number of winners to be decided
- Twists will be sold for \$10.00 each. Final decision on Twists available will be decided closer to the event date (dependent on volunteers)
- Possible twists include
  - ✓ Team members wear gloves for 3 minutes
  - ✓ Take away puzzle box for 10 minutes (talked about doing this for everyone and they could pay to get box back early)
  - ✓ Have one member of team wear blindfold and other guide them for 3 minutes
  - ✓ Team members have to use tweezers for 3 minutes
  - ✓ Team members have arms behind back (zip tie or scrunchie) for 3 min
  - ✓ Send one person to jail (have to leave table / can't work on puzzle for 3 min
  - $\checkmark$  30 minutes (or time to be determined) break and teams can bid to swap puzzle
- Fuse will donate % of sales during evening of this event (what times?)
- Fuse will donate gift card for prize(s) First and Second?
- Suggest have team names / used flier display stands to designate

Decisions on twists and details will be made closer to the event – when we know number of volunteers available.

### Fundraising, Marketing and Public Relations Committee – Notes from June 2, 2025 Meeting

Members of the JKPL Fundraising, Marketing and Public Relations Committee met on Monday, June 2, 2025 at 5:15 pm. Attendees were Alex Wiezorek, Monika Steffen, and Shirley Vonderhaar.

**NWL Trivia Event (partnership with O So Good):** We have not yet heard the final results from O So Good.

**Spring Plant Sale:** This annual event was held on May 17 from 9 to 11 am. It was very successful with a total of \$752.00 being raised.

**Garage Sale Fundraiser:** This annual event is scheduled for Saturday, June 7 from 9 am to 3 pm and Sunday, June 8 from 1 to 4 pm – library open hours. This is the same weekend as the City-Wide Garage Sales and Spring Farm Toy Show. Plans for this event are as follows:

- Items may be brought to the JKPL during library hours Tuesday, June 3 Friday, June 6.
- Based on the current weather forecast, this event will be held primarily in the parking lot on Saturday and in the Hoffman Room and other spaces in the library on Sunday.
- Monika will bring in some large boxes to use for preliminary sorting, and tables and spaces in the Hoffman Room will be labeled into general categories: Kitchen, Clothing, Baby/Small Children, Outerwear, Shoes and Bags, Seasonal / Holiday, Décor. Donors will be encouraged to sort items as they are brought in – if possible.
- Items will be priced: Donation, \$1.00, \$2.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, \$20.00 or as marked if there are higher value items donated. Guests will also be able to purchase a box for \$20.00 and fill it with \$1.00 items. Dots will be used to color code the items as well as sorting by table / location. On Sunday, all items left will be available for a donation.
- Volunteers will sort and label all items on Friday. Work will start at 4:00 pm and continue until complete. Alex will take the lead on this. Other volunteers are Rory W., Monika, Catherine, Beth D. and Shirley. More volunteers are welcome! Alex will take the Garage Sale signs and put them up later on Friday evening and library staff will put up the cones at the parking lot entry when they leave for the day. Someone will need to go out on Sunday to take down the signs.
- Volunteers are needed early Saturday morning for final set up (taking things into the parking lot, weather permitting, or arranging in the library). Alex and Rory will arrive at 7:00 am to start work. Beth D. offered to help from 7 to 9 am. Shirley will also plan to be there and Paul should arrive about 8 am. Additional workers are welcome! We will use the steel tables and brown tables first, and other tables as needed. We will set up the canopy over the money table.
- Volunteers are needed to work the sale from 9 am to 3 pm on Saturday. Once everything is set up, two workers is probably sufficient. Alex and Rory will plan to work most of the day but will need a break. Catherine said she might be able to help in the afternoon and Melissa is available 10 am to 2 pm. Shirley will confirm who can work and put together a schedule. Sunday from 1 to 4 pm is a donation sale so library staff will just accept donations at the desk and no additional workers are needed.

- Volunteers are needed after 3 pm on Saturday to relocate everything left from sale back into the library. Paul is going to ask his friends to come and help (like they did for clean up last year). Shirley will send out an email to see if any Board members can help.
- Items not sold will be disposed of as the Friends, library staff, and JKPL Fundraising Committee decide. After the sale, Shirley will be on hand to evaluate keeping items for library purposes and activities collection, prizes and incentives, etc. Everything else will be donated. Monika suggested we could contact Resources Unite or the Maria House to let them know to come on Sunday, if they were interested. She has also contacted Camp Courageous about arranging a pick up. If Camp Courageous is not interested or available, items not kept for library purposes will be donated to Goodwill. Volunteers may be needed to pack up and transport. Paul will ask his friends to come and help (like they did for clean up last year) if they are needed. Alex is not available on Sunday. Shirley will send out an email to see if any Board members can help.
- One sandwich board will be used to document color coding and pricing and be located adjacent to the money table. The other will post sale hours and be located on the sidewalk corner. There will also be a sign at the payment table that says "Donations Welcome". We will plan to have \$100 in cash to make change.

**Puzzle Fundraiser:** This event will be held on Wednesday, June 25, 2025. Cost will be \$80.00 for team of up to 4 individuals. Tickets must be purchased in advance, with a maximum of 20 tables. If the number sold fits into the bar area, that is the preferred location. Details for this event are:

- Each team will receive a puzzle, 4 drink tickets and 1 coupon for an appetizer to share (must be consumed at this event). Twenty 500-piece puzzles have arrived. Puzzles will be unsealed and put into bags so participants don't see ahead of time. Library will create tear off pages for the 4 drink coupons and 1 appetizer.
- Check in for the event will start at 5 pm with the puzzle contest starting at 6 pm
- Each team will receive 2 chances to win a Twist to start out the event. The committee will decide on the number of winners based on tickets sold. Shirley has a roll of tickets that can be used for this.
- Twists will be sold for \$5.00 each. Current plan for twists includes:
  - ✓ Team members wear gloves for 3 minutes
  - ✓ Take away puzzle box for 10 minutes (talked about doing this for everyone and they could pay to get box back early no firm decision made)
  - ✓ Have one member of team wear blindfold and other guide them for 3 minutes
  - ✓ Team members have to use tweezers for 3 minutes
  - ✓ Team members have arms behind back (use scrunchie like handcuffs) for 3 min
  - ✓ Send one person to jail (have to leave table / can't work on puzzle) for 3 min; for \$20 could send the whole team to jail
  - ✓ 30 minutes (or time to be determined based on how quickly puzzles are coming together) break and teams can bid to swap puzzle
- Fuse will donate percentage of sales during evening of this event and prizes for First and Second. Monika will check with Fuse regarding what items and times will be included in the donation and suggest gift cards be included with whatever prize combination they prefer (tshirt, koozies, etc.).

- Alex will MC this event so will need to take speaker and microphone for his use. Committee also
  wants to have a donation jar available. Set up will start about 4 pm and include putting tagboard
  on tables for puzzle base and having team names / numbers posted at each table. Supplies for
  twists include: gloves, bandanas for blindfolds, tweezers (Monika said she could borrow),
  scrunchies, and timers. The committee agreed to use tablets from the JKPL Library of Things for
  timers. Shirley will talk to Paul and setting up tablets for this purpose.
- Many volunteers are needed for this event. Alex will MC and work the whole event. Melissa
  offered to help set up and check in. Monika offered to help set up but would like to participate if
  possible. Catherine is available to help after 5 pm. Beth D. offered to help when most needed.
  The committee felt that 2 or 3 people would be sufficient for set up and check in but ideally five
  people would be available to help during the contest. Shirley will send out an email to see who
  can work.

**Book Art Show and Fundraiser:** This annual event is being modified to hopefully increase participation and income. Registration will start on Monday, June 16 with participants signing up and taking books for their creations. This event will also be promoted at the June 28 Downtown Market and participants will be able to sign up and get their supplies there as well. Participants will bring their creations to the library anytime in July before July 26. They will be asked if they want their item returned or if they would like to donate it to the library for a silent auction.

There are two parts to this event. First is the voting for favorites at the July Downtown Market:

- All items will be taken to the July 26 Downtown Market and people will vote for their favorites by putting cash in jars. Alex will manage this.
- The creator of the art with the most money will win a special prize. Alex will check with Happy Joe's about donating pizza, soda, and tokens for the prize.
- Creators who want their items back should pick them up at the Market or at the JKPL at any time after the 26th.

A Silent Auction of the Book Art will be held at the library starting on July 1 (or when book art items are brought in) to August 2.

- Library staff will run the Silent Auction as they do other Silent Auctions.
- Starting bid for all items will be \$1.00, with bids to be increased by a minimum of \$1.00
- The Silent Auction will continue until Saturday, August 2, 2025.

**Summer Fundraiser Partnership:** The Committee discussed the idea of partnering with DQ for a percentage of sales fundraiser. We could take the book bike to their green space and give away books / talk about the library during this time. The committee agreed that this a good idea so will consider for a July or August activity.

**Restaurant Partnership:** Shirley forwarded a message about a fundraiser being held by the Carnegie-Stout Foundation. Red Robin in Dubuque was giving 20% of sales to the Foundation for every purchase when the customer mentioned the library foundation. This was held over a weekend. The Committee agreed this kind of event would be an easy way to raise money and could be a win for both the restaurant and the library. They will discuss this idea further at a future meeting.

#### MARKETING:

**Radio Interview:** The committee would like to schedule another interview for later in June – to talk about the Puzzle Fundraiser, the Book Art Fundraiser, and any other relevant topics. Monika said her summer was flexible so Shirley will ask Dawn to coordinate and schedule.

**Pop-Up Library at Downtown Summer Night:** These events will be June 13 and August 8 from 5:30 to 9:00 pm (not holding in July) this summer. Shirley will manage this on the 13th and check to see if any Board members are available as well.

**Marketing at the Downtown Markets:** The committee agreed that there should be signage of some kind at the Downtown Market so that people know that activities like the Stream Study and Bubbles are sponsored by the JKPL and Friends. Shirley will talk to Paul and Christa about using a sandwich board, banner or some kind of signage at library sponsored events at the Market.

**Book Bike:** We are still looking for an accessible location to store the book bike for the summer. A staff member offered a secluded outdoor space at their home if it would work to cover with a tarp. Shirley wondered about investing in a small storage shed, if the city would allow it to be placed somewhere. No decision was made.

The committee also suggested taking the Book Bike to the pool this summer as a way to reach more people. Shirley with talk with Paul and Adam (Parks and Rec Dept) to see if this can be arranged.

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# Enrich Iowa Agreement -Public Library FY26 (July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026)



## State Library of Iowa

The Enrich lowa program includes Direct State Aid for public libraries, Open Access for public and academic libraries, and Interlibrary Loan Reimbursement. The library will participate according to the Terms of Agreement for each program. Enrich lowa funding is appropriated annually by the lowa Legislature. The state budget for the upcoming fiscal year has been passed by the legislature and will become effective upon the Governor's signature.

### **1. General Provisions**

- A. Libraries must return this completed Enrich Iowa Agreement indicating the programs the library will participate in. This form must be signed by the library director or other signatory authority. This completed form must be received by the State Library, Des Moines office, by **June 20, 2025.**
- B. A public library must participate in Open Access and Interlibrary Loan Reimbursement in order to be eligible for Direct State Aid funding.
- C. A public library must meet Direct State Aid Tier 1 requirements or higher in order to receive Open Access or Direct State Aid funding.
- D. A library may choose to participate in Interlibrary Loan Reimbursement without participating in Direct State Aid or Open Access.

### 2. Assurances

- A. Our public library named below was established on or before July 1, 2022, in accord with the Code of Iowa.
- B. Our public library meets Tier 1 requirements or higher. This is required for Open Access and Direct State Aid funding.
- c. Our public library has submitted, to the State Library, a copy of the most recent ordinance or other legal documentation establishing our library as a public library.
- D. Our library will meet FY26 program reporting requirements.
- E. Our library will use all Enrich lowa funds to improve library services.
- F. Our library's Enrich Iowa funds will supplement, not supplant, any other funding received by the library. Our library will inform the city and/or county of this requirement and we will report noncompliance to the State Library. We understand that if the funding is used to replace local funds, the funds received must be returned and our library will not be eligible for Enrich Iowa funding the following year.
- G. Our library will provide information for auditing purposes, if requested by the State Library.

## IN ORDER TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ENRICH IOWA PROGRAM, YOU MUST CHECK AT LEAST ONE OF THE PROGRAMS LISTED BELOW

Direct State Aid - Direct State Aid is state funding to public libraries intended to improve library services and to reduce inequities among communities in the delivery of library services. Based on Accreditation Tier Level.

Open Access - Open Access pays public and academic libraries to serve eligible lowa residents from outside their local jurisdiction. The purpose of the Open Access program is to offer lowa residents access to public and academic libraries all over the state, so that lowans have the convenience of using a library where they work, go to school, shop, or visit.

Interlibrary Loan Reimbursement - Interlibrary Loan Reimbursement provides lowans with equal access to library resources by encouraging and supporting interlibrary loan among libraries of all types.
