





Reading Colors Your World: Adult Summer Library Program

Have fun reading, attending programs, participating in activities, using library services, & earn prizes!!!

- ♦ For ages 18 or older with a James Kennedy Public Library card
- ◆ Sign up online at dyersvillelibrary.readsquared.com or in person. Participants receive a book bag, bookmark and free book just for signing up. If you sign up online, please be sure to make arrangements to pick these items up at your next library visit or via curbside service.
- Earn prizes by doing any of the following activities:
 - ♦ Reading or listening to books
 - ♦ Submitting reviews
 - Viewing or participating in programs
 - ♦ Completing activities such as Take and Make or other Activity kits
 - ♦ Using library services such as Mango (learning a language), Ancestry (genealogy), Brainfuse (job seeking and homework help), and AtoZ World Culture (travel). These are examples—many others available!
- Completed activities may be tracked by using the READsquared webpage, app, or the printed log.
- For each item completed, the participant's name will be entered into a drawing for prizes. Participants completing four items will receive a themed keychain or luggage tag, those completing eight items may select a themed mood pen or highlighter and sticky notes, and those completing twelve items will be able to select an item from a prize box. Participants are always welcome to select a book instead of the regular prize. Participants completing at least sixteen activities, which must include reading at least four books, will have completed the program. They will earn a special prize and have their name entered into the grand prize drawing for a Book Lover's Basket and other prizes.
- Due to COVID-19, in person programs in the library will not be offered; however, the library is planning virtual programs,
 Take-and-Make activities, and more. See below for some of the activities scheduled.

NOTE: Summer Library Programs for all ages will be using READsquared so you can sign up for yourself and your family all at the same time!

Special programs and activities scheduled for June:

Up-Cycled Greeting Cards for Father's Day: June 1-19. Librarian Ann B. has created a video, posted on the library's Facebook page and YouTube channel, to show you how to use the fronts of donated greeting cards combined with glue and cardstock to make entirely new greeting cards. The library has some kits ready for you to pick up. Each kit includes a themed greeting card front with coordinating cardstock. All you need is glue. Kits available while supplies last.

Get Puzzled @ Your Library. While we still aren't able to work on a puzzle together here at the library, share with us what you are doing at home! Post a picture or description of your jigsaw puzzle, in progress or finished, to the library's Facebook page, email librarian@dyersville.lib.ia.us, or call the library to share what you are working on. Everyone who shares in some fashion will get their name entered into a drawing to win a 1000 piece puzzle! This month-long event will continue until we are able to "get puzzled" together at the library. And remember we have puzzles to check out if you need one!

Coloring, Creating and Doing @ Your Library. The JKPL is continuing to offer coloring pages, dot to dot, crosswords, sudoku, and other activities for you to work on at home. They are intended for adults and teens. Each pack will include at least ten different pages. These items can be picked up at a library visit or requested for curbside pick up. Limited table space is now available for visitors to work on these in the library. NOTE: If you need something to color with, colored pencils may be provided upon request - just ask!

Virtual Sit and Stitch: Wednesdays, June 2, 9, 16, 23, & 30 from 1:00—3:00 pm. Grab your tablet, phone or computer along with your hobby and/or craft and join other crafters at this fun Zoom gathering. There are lots of laughs, great company, conversation, and even some crafting! New members are welcome to join at any time by registering at https://bit.ly/SitStitch. The same link is used each week. Weather permitting, this group may decide to meet outdoors, socially distanced in a local park.

Whimsical Illustrations with Dianne Kramer: Wednesdays, June 9 & 23 @ 6:30 pm. Join Dianne Kramer for this special Reading Colors Your World event! In the first 90-minute Zoom presentation, participants will learn tips and techniques for drawing and coloring quaint and fanciful little characters. It's fun and easy and can lead to many hours of imaginative drawing! Whimsical Illustrations, Part 2 will expand on what you learned in the first session. A free packet of materials to be used in the class, including pen, paper, and colored pencils, will be provided to all participants who register before June 7. Materials kits should be available starting June 1. Materials will be provided to later registrants while supplies last. Barring technical difficulties, these presentations will be recorded and posted on the library's Facebook page and YouTube channel.

World Wide Knit in Public Day: Saturday, June 12 from 2:00-4:00 pm. Held on the second Saturday of June, WWKIP Day is a special annual event to celebrate knitting and all fiber crafts as a community activity. Join the JKPL Sit 'n' Stitch group in the parking lot adjacent to the library to celebrate this special day. Bring your own project or just come see these talented crafters in action and learn about crafting!

Happi Hibachi Fundraiser and Summer Reading Kick-off: Monday, June 14 from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm at Commercial Club Park. Join us at the Commercial Club Park to kick off the start of Summer Reading, participate in some fun activities, and enjoy some great food! The Happi Hibachi Food Truck will be on hand selling food and will donate a percentage of sales to the JKPL. The more you eat the more we earn! Visitors will be able to select a free book to keep from the pop-up library as well as learn more about library services. The library will also have a hotspot running to provide WiFi access. Library staff and volunteers will be hosting fun outdoor activities including life-size games. Children can help create a collaborative art piece by throwing paint-filled water balloons at a canvas. The art work will be displayed in the library. (The paint is washable, but play clothes are strongly recommended!) All ages are also welcome to try their hand at karaoke, using the system available to borrow from the JKPL Library of Things! Masks are encouraged and hand sanitizer will be available. Social Issues Book Club: June 14 & 29 @ 6:00 pm. The library is pleased to announce our limited edition Social Issues Book Club for Young Adults. In this 6 month series, participants will read and discuss one book each month that highlights a particular social issue. While this program is designed for young and emerging adults, 15 to 25 years of age, teens and adults of all ages are welcome. At these initial meetings, we will gather feedback from participants about topics of interest and best times to meet. These sessions will be held via Zoom and participants need to register at bit.ly/YASOCIALISSUES in order to receive a link. Surveys are also available on the library's social media, website, or you can pick up a print copy at the library. All feedback is welcome! The surveys will be available until June 29. This program series is made possible by the Libraries Transforming Communities: Focus on Small and Rural Libraries Grant from the American Library Association.

Adult Crafternoon Take-and-Make: Faux Stained Glass Art: Monday, June 14—30: This month's activity is tied into the summer library program theme of Reading Colors Your World and will take at least two-days to complete as time is needed for drying. This month we will be making faux stained glass art using a picture frame, paint, and mod podge. The instructional video for how to do the craft will be available starting June 14. Kits should include most supplies needed and are available to pick up during a library visit or curbside service. Adult Crafternoon programs are sponsored by FGH Delivery.
