

### How to participate?

Teen and Adults (13 and older) with a JKPL card are eligible to participate. Get your bingo card from the library or print it off from the library website and decide which squares you want to complete to earn your entry into the prize drawing. Each bingo completed, horizontally, vertically, or diagonally, will qualify you for an entry. If you're feeling really ambitious, a black out bingo is an option and earns you a special JKPL goodie bag! Every time you complete a square, fill in the blank with what you read or did and ask a library staff member to initial that square for you. Not sure about something? Ask a librarian! (That fills a block too.)

### How much time do you have to complete this card?

Our winter reading program will run during the months of January and February. That gives you eight weeks to play!

### Why should you play?

Because it is fun to try something new and challenge yourself! Take this opportunity to read something new, attend a program or event, or try out a different service or format. You might be surprised at what you can discover at your library! Of course, the opportunity to win a prize in the prize drawing is also a good reason to play.

### What do you do with the card when finished?

Bring the finished card into the library on or before March 4 and show us your bingos. Your name will then be entered into a random drawing for prizes. There is a maximum of three entries per person. Grand prize will be a tablet or eReader (actual product to be decided.) If you have a blackout bingo you will also earn a JKPL goodie bag. After we see the proof of your accomplishment you may do what you wish with the card. Share it with a friend to show the fun things you can do at the library. Take a picture and post it on your Facebook showing everyone how well-read you are. Use it as a reminder of the services your library offers.
